

Ship *Flower*, of New Bedford, Cruising
Sunday, August 4th 1861
Strong Gale. hant. with a strong gale from the S. E. heading S. S. W. under Fore Sail, and Main top Sail, at sunset took in the Fore Sail, and Main top Sail, and hove too under spencers, at daylight set the Main top Sail, latter parts strong gale, and squally. Lat 19. 30. S.

Strong Gale. Monday, August 5th 1861
Throughout these 24 hours strong gale from S. E. to S. S. E. with hard squalls of wind and rain, the ship heading from South to S. W. under storm sails, so Ends. Lat 20. 12. S.

Strong Gale. Tuesday, August 6th 1861
All these 24 hours strong Gale and squally, heading to the South under storm sails, so Ends. Lat 20. 30. South, Long by obs 60. 06. E.

Strong Gale. Wednesday, August 7th 1861
hant. with strong gale and squally heading to the S. S. W. under storm sails, at 1. P. M. were ship to the S. S. E. and set a reef, Fore Sail and close reefed Fore top Sail, at sunset furled the Fore Sails, at daylight set it again, at 9. A. M. reefed the Main Sail, and set and close reefed Mizzen top Sail, latter part better weather, saw a Bark, so Ends Lat 19. 19. S. 60. 33. E.

Strong Trade. Thursday, August 8th 1861
Begins with strong trade and rugged, heading S. S. E. under close reefs, and reefed Courses, at 1. P. M. were ship to the South, at 3. A. M. were to the N. E. latter part under double reefs & courses, so Ends, Lat 19. 18. S. Long 60. 30. E.

Strong Trade. Friday August 9th 1861
hant. with strong trade heading S. S. E. under double reefs, courses &c. at sunset shortened sail, at 2. A. M. were ship to the South, at daylight made Sail at 9. A. M. were ship to the S. S. E. latter part good weather, under all sail, Lat 19. 02. S. Long 60. 39. E.

off. the Gale of Rodriguez, A. N. Perkins, Master,
Saturday, August 10th 1861
Sea. Watch. hant. with brisk trade, heading S. S. E. under all sail, at sunset took in the light sails, stood sea watches, middle and latter parts strong trade, so Ends. Lat. by obs. 19. 52. S. Long 60. 55. E.

S. Trade. Sunday, August 11th 1861
All these 24 hours strong trade and squally, heading from East, to S. S. E. under all possible sail, beating to windward, so Ends. Lat 19. 08. S.

Squally. Monday, August 13th 1861
Begins with strong trade were ship to the S. S. E. under double reefs and Fore Sail, middle & latter parts strong trade with hard squalls of wind and rain, heading S. S. E. so Ends. Lat 19. 19. S.

Strong Trade. Tuesday, August 13th 1861
hant. with strong trade and rugged, with strong flaves of wind, heading S. S. E. under double reefs and Courses, at 4. 30. P. M. furled the Main Sail, and close reefed the Fore top Sail, middle & latter parts better weather, so Ends. Latitude 20. 30. S. Long 61. 28. East

Breaches. Wednesday, August 14th 1861
hant. with strong trade heading S. S. E. under double reefs &c. at 12. 30. saw a breach to windward, tacked for it but saw nothing more of it, at 4. 30 P. M. tacked to the South, saw a Bark, at 8. A. M. tacked to the N. E. saw a Fair bark, La Sail, so Ends Lat by obs. 21. 02. S. Long by obs. 61. 30. East, latter part fine weather.

Bk. Champion. Thursday, August 15th 1861
Begins with moderate trade and fine weather, heading N. E. all sail out, at 4. 30 P. M. spoke the Bark. Champion Cogshall Master 32. months, 300. T. at 10. 30 were ship to the S. S. E. at 2. A. M. were ship to the Eastward, latter part fine weather, so Ends. Lat 20. 30. S. Long 63. 30. East
