 Tuesday. August 27th 1861
 New. Libb. band. with strong trade, heading South
 under double reefs. Fore Sail, Libb. & Spanker,
 middle & latter parts strong trade. split the
 Libb. and bent a new one. Saw several Sails,
 So Ends, the Land 10. miles dist.

Wednesday. August 28th 1861
 New. T. M. L. Sail, band. with strong trade, under all possible
 Sail, beating to windward. Saw several Sails,
 and the Land, bent a new Fore T. M. L. Sail,
 latter part repairing the Libb. spoke the Eliska
 Dunbar with 600. S. So Ends, under all Sail
 except Fore & Miz. top G. Sails. Lat 30. 13. S.

Thursday. August 29th 1861
 New. Main
 top Sail, Begins with moderate trade Main top. G. Sail
 and flying Libb. out, in company with the
 E. Dunbar, at sunset shortened Sail heading
 in shore. at 9. 30. P. M. wore ship off shore,
 middle & latter parts strong breeze. Saw several
 Sails, bent a new Main top Sail and put the
 good one forward. So Ends. no other

Friday August 30th 1861
 Bk. Draco band. with brisk trade under short sail,
 the Land about 10. miles dist. at 3. P. M. spoke
 the Bk. Draco, North, 20. months out 800. S. 450. M.
 took out beef & Pork middle & latter parts sugared
 So Ends.

Saturday. August 31st 1861
 Bk. Draco, All these 24 hours brisk trade under short
 sail. gamming with the Draco. got 1764 lbs of
 game from her, and let her have three Barrels
 of Flour. Saw several Sails, So Ends.

Sunday. Sept. 1st 1861
 Gamming band. with Moderate trade, under short sail
 gamming with several ships. latter part good weather
 Saw several Sails, So Ends. Lat 30. 00. S.

off. Rodrigue A. N. Perkins. Master.
 Monday. September 3rd 1861
 Bk. America. band. with brisk trade under moderate
 Sail. heading in shore, spoke the Bk. America
 Saw several Sails. at 8. P. M. wore ship off
 shore. at 9. A. M. wore in shore. latter part
 drizzly rain. broke out water. Molasses, and
 fill two casks with salt water. So Ends, rainy.

Tuesday. Sept. 3rd 1861
 Rainy. Begins with thick weather and fine rain
 Saw the land the ship heading to the East.
 under double reefs, courses, Libb. & Spanker, at
 3. 30. P. M. wore ship to the S. W. the land
 at sunset bearing S. E. 10. miles dist. at daylight
 wore ship to the Eastward. latter part brisk trade
 Saw five Sails, and the Land. So Ends. 30. 15. S.

Wednesday. Sept. 4th 1861
 S. Splendid. band. with brisk trade, run off for the reef &
 changed the heads. spoke the Kattken and
 the Splendid of Sagastown, Norton. Master.
 33. months out 1400. S. 350. hump back. oil.
 at 11. P. M. parted company. heading E. N. E.
 latter part steered E. by N. saw three Sails So Ends
 Latitude by observation 19. 32 S. Long 63. 58. E

Thursday. Sept. 5th 1861
 Strong trade. Begins with strong trade, under double reefs.
 courses, Libb. & Main sail. Steering E. by N. at
 sunset shortened sail and luffed by the wind
 to the E. by S. at daylight made sail, latter part
 squally. Saw the Kattken. So Ends. Lat 18. 19. S.

Friday September 6th 1861
 Bk. Kattken. band. with fresh trade and some squally,
 heading to the E. N. E. under double reefs. spoke the
 Kattken. shortened sail. at 5. A. M. wore ship
 to the S. E. and made sail. Saw a Fin back.
 and the Kattken. latter part fresh and clear
 So Ends. Lat 18. 05. S. Long. by thro. 65. 15. E.
