Strong trade	Tuesday, Sept. 17 th 1861 All these 24 hours strong trade and rugged under short sail working to windward. Saw three sails. So Ends. Land in sight.
Sk. Messenger	Wednesday, Sept. 18 th 1861 Came with fresh trade under short sail, heading to the South, at 2.30 P.M. spoke the Bark Messenger, at sunset shortened sail, at daylight were ship in shore and made same sail, latter part under top sails &c. more moderate. So Ends. Lat by Obs 30. 07. S.
G. Splendid	Thursday, Sept. 19 th 1861 All these 24 hours brisk trade and good whale weather, shortened and made sail, spoke the Splendid, saw the Land & 7. Sails. So Ends. Lat 29. 55. S. Long 62. 45. E.
Brisk trade	Friday, September 30 th 1861 Came with brisk trade, heading S. N. E. Flying Libb, and Main T. G. sail out, at 3. P.M. spoke the Pamelia but did not gam with her. at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made sail saw several sails, and the land. So Ends. Latitude by Obs. 30. 00. South.
Brisk trade	Saturday, September 31 st 1861 All these 24 hours. brisk trade, under short sail looking hard but all in vain. Saw several sails and the Land So Ends. Lat 19. 57. S.
G. Tephys	Sunday, September 32 nd 1861 All these 24 hours brisk trade and fair weather spoke the Tephys, saw 15. sails, at 11. A.M. spoke the San Francisco, with 200 & 200. W. So Ends.

the Isle of Rodriguez	A. N. Perkins. Master. Munday, Sept. 23 rd 1861 All these 24 hours brisk trade under all sail gamming with three sails, saw 16. sails. So Ends. no observation.
Bk. America	Tuesday, September 24 th 1861 Came with fresh trade, at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made sail, at 10. A.M. spoke the Bark America, and run off. Saw a bark and thought she was whaling, So Ends. no Obs. latter part brisk trade.
Gamming	Wednesday, September 25 th 1861 Begins with fresh trade heading to the N.E. gamming with the America, at 2.40 P.M. saw a Bark whaling, run for her at 4. P.M. saw several boats down from several ships at 5. P.M. lowered our boats in company with the America but all in vain for the want of moon daylight, took up the boats and stood to the Eastward and took in sail. At daylight run off to the Westward in company with the San Francisco, saw 14 sails. So Ends. no Obs.
Gamming	Thursday, September 26 th 1861 All these 24 hours light trade and fine weather spoke the America and gained with her & the San Francisco, shortened and made sail, run out of sight of the Island to the W. N. W. saw several sails. So Ends. Lat 19. 16. South
Gamming	Friday, Sept. 27 th 1861 Came with fine pleasant weather running to the W. S. W. under all sail at 4. P.M. spoke the America & San Francisco, and shortened sail heading to the South, at daylight made sail saw nothing but ships. So Ends. fresh trade. Lat 20. 20. Long 62. 16. E.
Good weather	Saturday, Sept. 28 th 1861 All these 24 hours brisk trade and good weather shortened and made sail saw two sails. So Ends. Latitude by Obs. 30. 16. S.
