

Ship Flaver, of New Bedford, cruising
 Saturday, Octo: 12th 1861
 Strong trade, hauled with strong trade heading S. E. under short sail, the Lophyr astern, at sunset shortened sail, at 5. & 16. wore ship to the South, latter part rugged, So Ends, Lat 19.00. S.

Strong trade, All these 24 hours Strong breeze & rugged under short sail working to windward, Saw two sails, So Ends, Lat 19.48. S Long 62.25

Strong trade, hauled with a strong breeze from South East, and rugged heading to the S. E. under short sail, at sunset shortened sail, at daylight wore ship to the South and made sail, Saw four sails, at 10. & 16. steered S. W. So Ends Lat 19.28. S Saw the Land

Blk. Kathleen, hauled with brisk winds from S. E. and good weather running off under all sail except Fore Miz. T. G. sails, at 3. P. M. spoke the Kathleen, at sunset luffed to the S. E. raining, at 8. P. M. parted company, wore ship to the S. S. W. at daylight steered S. W. and made all sail, Saw a sail, So Ends Lat 19.40. S

Pleasant, All these 24 hours light pleasant weather Steered various courses, shortened & made sail, Saw two sails, So Ends, Lat 19.33. S. Long 61.25. E

All Sail, hauled with a light southerly breeze, under all sail heading N. S. W. at sunset tacked to the E. S. E. and took in the light sails, at daylight steered N. W. all sail out, Saw nothing, So Ends with a brisk breeze Lat by Obs. 19.50. S. Long 60.45. E

off. Rodrigue Is. H. N. Perkins, Master, Friday October 18th 1861
 Breezy, hauled with a fresh breeze from the East heading to the South, under double reef, at sunset thick weather shortened sail, and stood boats crew watches, at daylight wore to the Eastward and made all sail, latter part shortened, sail more breeze, So Ends, Lat 19.38. S.

Breezy, Begins with a fresh breeze from the South heading to the S. E. under moderate sail, at sunset shortened sail, middle part moderate at sunrise wore ship to the S. S. W. and made sail, latter part more breeze took in the light sails, So Ends, Lat by Obs 19.40. S. no sights.

Moderate, hauled with a moderate breeze from the S. E. and smoky weather, steered S. W. by E. under top sails, at sunset luffed to the S. E. and took in sail, at sunrise made sail and wore ship to the North, latter part moderate, Saw nothing, So ends, Lat by Obs. 19.48. S. Long

Moderate, hauled with moderate trade steering North, flying Libb & Main T. G. sail out, at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made all sail, wore ship to the South, latter part moderate, So Ends, Lat 19.39. S.

Breeches, hauled with moderate trade heading S. S. W. all sail out, at sunset shortened sail, at daylight wore ship to the N. E. Saw one whale, and a merchant man, at 11.30. A. M. Mr Joseph saw a porpoise 10 miles off. & pointed forward the lee beam, latter part moderate running for the Porpoise, with a few T. M. S. sail out So Ends, Lat. by Observation. 19.48. South no sights.
