

Ship Rover, of New Bedford, cruising
 Wednesday, October 23rd 1861
 Breaches, Begins with fresh trade running for the
 Breaches all sail out. at 1.30. P.M. rose Breaches
 off the weather gear two four miles off.
 saw spouts, supposed them to be sperm
 whales but not certain, tacked twice for
 them, at sunset shortened sail, heading
 N.E. at daylight made all sail. So Ends Lat 19.40 S

Bark
 San Francisco, Thursday, October 24th 1861
 All these 24 hours light trade and good weather
 shortened & made sail heading on different tack
 spoke the San Francisco. So Ends. Lat 19.32 S. Long 58.32

Bark
 San Francisco, Friday, October 25th 1861
 All these 24 hours, light trades, and pleasant
 weather. heading different ways. shortened & made
 sail. at 6 A.M. saw the Land supposed it to be
 Round Island 30 miles dist. spoke the San Francisco.
 saw another sail, decapied and slashed the Masts.
 So Ends. Latitude by Observation, 19.41 South.

Anchored
 at
 Mauritius, Saturday, October 26th 1861
 came with light trade and fine weather heading
 to the N.E. all sail out. the San Francisco in
 company weather ship, and broke out Bread
 at night spoke the San Francisco. tacked several
 times during the night, at 3 A.M. saw the
 Light on round Island. at daylight made
 all sail. at 10.30 A.M. bent the chains and got
 the anchor off at 12.30. let go the Larboard.
 Anchored in 45 fathoms of water and paid out
 45 fathoms of chain. So Ends. furling sails.

Liberty, Sunday, October 27th 1861
 All these 24 hours fine weather sent the
 watch on shore. So Ends.

Tarring, Monday, October 28th 1861
 All these 24 hours fine weather all hands
 tarring, & shoring iron work. So Ends -

 Tuesday, October 29th 1861
 watering, All these 24 hours fine weather all hands
 employed in watering &c. sailed ship Brunswick
 So Ends.

Wood
 water, Wednesday, October 30th 1861
 All these 24 hours fine weather all hands.
 getting wood & water. So Ends. boating off
 provisions &c

Watering, Thursday, November 1st 1861
 All these 24 hours fine weather employed in
 getting water &c. So Ends.

Watering, Friday November 2nd 1861
 All these 24 hours light breeze and fine weather
 watering &c. So Ends.

Liberty, Saturday, November 3rd 1861
 All these 24 hours fresh breeze employed in painting
 &c. So Ends. the Starboard watch on liberty.
 Joseph Watson, William Goshin, John Beides & William L. Hardin.
 went on shore.

Liberty, Sunday, November 4th 1861
 came with a fresh breeze, middle part raining
 and calm, latter part fresh breeze. Arrived
 Pamela Meyer, Katherine & Young Phoenix.
 So Ends. the Starboard watch on shore. Received on
 board 11 bundles of Bone. from Bark Java 2nd.

Liberty, Monday, November 5th 1861
 came with a fresh land breeze, middle part
 rainey, latter part fresh breeze. Arrived Bark Champion
 So Ends. the Starboard watch on liberty.

Liberty, Tuesday November 5th 1861
 All these 24 hours fresh breeze one watch employed
 in painting &c. the other on liberty. So Ends.

Liberty, Wednesday, November 6th 1861
 All these 24 hours fresh breeze the watch painting
 the Boats, the other on liberty. So Ends getting
 wood &c.
