Liberty Stopt	Friday, Nov. 8 th 1861 All these 24 hours fine weather, sent the Old Fore top sail, painting Boats &c. So Ends. Liberty stopt.
various Jobs.	Saturday, Nov. 9 th 1861 All these 24 light pleasant weather. All hands employed in various Jobs So Ends.
Nothing.	Sunday, Nov. 10 th 1861 Throughout these 24 hours light pleasant weather. So Ends.
Getting recruits.	Monday, Nov. 11 th 1861 All these 24 hours brisk trade, employed in getting recruits and shipping men, So Ends.
Shipping Men.	Tuesday, Nov. 12 th 1861 All these 24 brisk trade, Shipped Richard Willis as seaman, Richard Holland, Do. ^{James} Robert ^{Henry} Thomas , Do. Charles Harris Do. Antonio Legera Do. John Greener as Boat Steerer & Joseph Fraggot as Cook.
All ready.	Wednesday Nov. 13 th 1861 Land. with a light sea breeze, middle part light land breeze. latter part sea breeze, sailed young Phoenix & Messenger. So Ends. all ready for sea.
More Men.	Thursday, Nov. 14 th 1861 Land. with a light sea breeze, all ready for sea with the exception of shipping one more man, middle & latter part light westerly winds. So Ends.

Underway.	Friday November 15 th 1861 The first and middle parts light westerly breeze all ready for sea. at 7 A.M. got under way for sea showed the Anchors and put the chains below. at 13. noon the Captain came on board, made all sail and steered W by S. So Ends.
Men.	Saturday, Nov. 16 th 1861 Land. with a light breeze from the N.W. under all sail. at sunset shortened sail, some rain, found three men on board that did not belong to the ship, at daylight made all sail. saw the Mauritius & 4 sails. So Ends. Lat 20.58. South
B. Dunbar,	Sunday, Nov. 17 th 1861 Land. with a light wind from N.W. under all sail. at 2 P.M. spoke the Eliska Dunbar, and let her have a man that was stowed away on board of us, middle part raining, saw Bourbon, the ship under short sail, at daylight made all sail heading W. S.W. saw the Dunbar So Ends. Lat 20.56. S.
Bourbon.	Monday, Nov. 18 th 1861 Land with a light breeze from N.W. to N.E. under all sail, steering in for the land. at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made all sail, steered West by S. saw three sails, latter part strong breeze. So Ends. no Obs.
All Sail.	Tuesday, Nov. 19 th 1861 Begins with a brisk breeze from N.E. steering W. S.W. all sail out at 3 P.M. took in Fore & Miz. T. G. sails, at sunset shortened sail. middle part some rain, at daylight made all sail. latter part wind light & variable. Bourbon bearing N.W. 35 miles distant, saw two sails. So Ends no Obs.
