Thursday, Jan'y 2^d, 1862

Reefed.

Cont. with a brisk wind from the N.W. heading W. & W. all sail out. at sunset shortened sail, at 4 P.M. the wind hauled to the S. & W. at daylight wore ship to the W. & W. and set double reefs & had some rain, latter part better weather, So ends. Lat 32. 34. S. Long 1. 38. W.

Friday, January 3^d, 1862

Reefed.

Begins with a brisk wind from the S.W. and cloudy weather steering W. & W. under double reefs & at sunset shortened sail heading West, at daylight made sail & wore ship to the E. & S. latter part moderate, So ends. Lat. by obs. 32. 23. S. Long none

Saturday, Jan'y 4th, 1862

S. Boat.

Cont. with a moderate breeze from the S.W. and fine weather heading E. & S. under all sail, at 4 P.M. put the Starboard Boat out, and shortened sail, at daylight made all sail & wore ship to the W. & W. latter part light weather, So ends. Lat 32. 14. S. Long 1. 21. W.

Sunday, January 5th, 1862

All Sail.

Begins with a light breeze from S. & W. and fine weather, heading N.W. under all sail, at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made all sail, latter part light breeze So ends. Lat 32. 05. S. Long 2. 37. W.

Monday, January 6th, 1862

All Sail.

Cont. with a gentle breeze from S. & W. and fine weather, heading N. by S. under all sail, at sunset, at sunset shortened sail, at sunrise made all sail, latter part light breeze, So ends. Lat by observation, 31. 47. S. Long by obs. 4. 06. W.

Tuesday, January 7th, 1862

All Sail.

Cont. with a light breeze from S. & W. and fine weather, heading N. by N. under all sail, at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made all sail, latter part calm So ends, Lat 31. 53. S. Long

Wednesday, January 8th, 1862

All Sail.

Begins with small breeze from the S. & W. and fine weather, heading to the W. & W. under all sail, at sunset shortened sail and wore ship to the S. & E. at daylight made all sail and stowed S. & E. latter part moderate breeze from the S.W. by W. So ends, Lat 31. 59. S. Long none

Thursday, January 9th, 1862

All Sail.

Cont. with a moderate breeze from the N.W. by W. and fine weather, stowed S. & E. all sail out, at sunset shortened sail, and luffed by the wind to the S. & W. at sunrise made sail and stowed S. & E. by S. latter part fresh breeze, So ends. Lat 32. 59. S. Long 1. 48. West.

Friday, January 10th, 1862

Fresh breeze

Begins with a fresh breeze from N.W. and fine weather, stowed S. & E. under top sails & fore sail, at sunset shortened sail, and luffed by the wind to the S. & W. at sunrise made sail, the ship heading E. & S. the wind S. & E. and fresh, So ends. Latitude by observation, 32. 52. S.

Saturday, January 11th, 1862

Fresh breeze

Cont. with a fresh breeze from S. & E. and smoky weather, the ship heading E. & S. under top sails courses & Lib & Spanker, at sunset shortened sail, & wore ship to the S. & E. at daylight set double reefed top sails & latter part breeze, So ends. Lat 33. 06. S. Long 2. 23. W.

Sunday, January 12th, 1862

Pumpers.

Begins with a fresh breeze from the E. & S. and smoky, heading S. & E. under double reefs & at sunset shortened sail, at sunrise made sail & stowed S. & E. by E. at 10. 30. saw Pumpers, latter part brisk wind, So ends, Lat 33. 36. S.
