Saturday, January, 25th 1862

Moderate. Comd. with a moderate breeze from South, and fair weather, steered N. E. under moderate sail, at 3.30 P. M. Signalized the Ship *Sda*, of Liverpool, steering S. W. by S. At sunset shortened sail, making E. S. E. at sunrise made sail & steered N. E. Saw two Merchantmen. Unbent the Fore top sail and bent the Old one & ends, repairing the top sail, Lat 28.10. S. Long by Obs. 6.34. East.

Sunday, January, 26th 1862

Begins with a moderate breeze from the S. E. and good weather steered North, N. N. W. & N. W. under all sail, at sunset shortened sail, heading West, at daylight made sail & steered N. W. by W. latter part light weather, saw a fine Grampuss, & ends. Lat. 27.50. S. Long 5.12. East.

Monday, January, 27th 1862

Comd. with light pleasant weather, the wind from the S. W. steered N. N. W. under all sail, at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made sail & steered N. W. Saw Pumpers, latter part fresh breeze, & ends. Lat 27.27. S. Long 4.27. E

Tuesday, January 28th 1862

Begins with a light breeze from S. E. and fine weather, steered N. W. under all sail, at sunset shortened sail, and luffed to the W. & W. at sunrise made sail & steered N. N. W. latter part fresh trade. Saw Pumpers & ends. Lat 27.28. South, Long East

Wednesday, January 29th 1862

Comd. with fresh trade & fine weather, steered N. N. by W. under all sail, at sunset shortened sail, and luffed to the S. W. at daylight made sail & steered N. N. W. latter part light trade, saw Pumpers, & ends. Lat 27.24. S. no long.

Thursday, January, 30th 1862

Nothing.

All these 24 hours light trade & good weather, steered N. N. W. shortened & made sail, saw nothing, & ends. Lat 27.15. S. Long 1.18. E.

Friday, January, 31st 1862

Comd. with light trade & fine weather, steered N. N. W. under all sail, at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made sail & steered West latter part light trade, saw a Sunfish, & ends. Lat 27.42. S. Long, none.

Nothing.

Saturday, February, 1st 1862

All these 24 hours light trade & fine weather, steered West, shortened & made sail, saw nothing, & ends. Lat 28.28. S. Long 3.32. West.

Pumpers.

Sunday, February, 2nd 1862

Comd. with Moderate Trade, steered S. W. by S. under all sail except Fore & Mizzen St. G. sails, at sunset shortened sail, heading N. E. at daylight made sail and steered N. W. at 6. A. M. Saw Pumpers, & ends. Lat 27.46.

Sent up Royal yards.

Monday, February 3rd 1862

Begins with brisk trade and fine weather, steered E. N. E. under all sail, at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made sail & steered E. N. E. sent up Royal yards for St. G. and bent the Main Royal & set it. & ends. Lat 27.27 S. Long by Obs. 4.25. W. Lunar 4.06. W

Brisk trade.

Tuesday, February 4th 1862

Comd. with brisk trade and good weather, steered E. N. E. under all sail, at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made sail & steered E. N. E. latter part some squally, saw nothing, & ends. Lat 26.27. S. Long 3.40
