

Ship	Plover, of New Bedford, Cruising
Monday, February 17 th 1862	All these 24 hours light weather heading to the N.W. by W. and S.W. Knight's shortened and made sail, saw a sail, & ends. Lat by Obs. 17.56. South, Long by Obs. 2.26.W.
Light trade,	Tuesday February 18 th 1862 Throughout these 24 hours light trade & fine weather, shortened & made sail, steered N.W. & ends. Lat 17.43. S. Long 3.13.30.W.
Light trade,	Wednesday, February 19 th 1862 All these 24 hours light trade, steered S.W. & shortened & made sail, saw a sail, & ends. Lat 17.21. S. Long 4.10. West.
Light trade,	Thursday, February 20 th 1862 All these 24 hours light trade & fine weather, steered S.W. & shortened & made sail, saw a sail, & ends. Lat 17.10. South Long by Obs. 4.35.W.
Light trade,	Friday February 21 st 1862 Commenced with a light breeze from S.E. & good weather, steered N.W. saw several sails, latter part light air, & ends, Lat 16.14. S.
Land ho.  St. Helena?	Saturday, February 22 nd 1862 Commenced with a light trade & fine weather steered N.W. by W. under all sail, at 5.30 P.M. saw the Island of St. Helena, bearing N.W. by W. 55 miles Dist, at dark shortened sail, heading S.W. at 3. A.M. wore ship to the East, at sunrise made sail & ran off, for the land, at 12 noon hauled to the S.W. & ends. Lat 16.14. South Long 5.02. W.
Whaling,	Sunday, February 23 rd 1862 Begins with moderate trade heading S.W. at 2 P.M. saw a ship whaling, at 3.20 P.M. lowered 4 Boats but fell in vain, at dark took up the Boats & took in sail, and spoke the Bark Janice, at 4.30 P.M. wore ship to the S.W. at sunrise made sail, latter part fresh trade saw the Pamela cutting, saw the land, & ends. Lat 16.36 S.

Off. St. Helena, Augustus N. Perkins, Master Bk. Falcon?	Monday, February 24 th 1862 Commenced with fresh trade heading East under whole top sails & at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made sail, at 4.30 A.M. spoke the Bark. Falcon, of New Bedford, Brailly, Master with 400. Spinn. saw the Island & several sails, & ends. Lat 16.38. S. no sights.
Bk. Falcon, S. Splendid,	Tuesday, February 25 th 1862 Begins with brisk trade heading S.W. gambling with the Falcon, at 6. P.M. spoke the Splendid, at dark took in sail, at 10. P.M. wore ship to the Eastward, at 3. A.M. wore to the S.W. at daylight made some sail, saw two sails and the land, at 4.30 A.M. wore ship to the Eastward, saw the Falcon, and the Bark, George & Henry of Newport, latter part fresh trade, & ends. Lat by Obs. 16.28. South,
Fresh trade,	Wednesday, February 26 th 1862 Commenced with fresh trade heading S.W. under moderate sail, at sunset shortened sail, at 3. A.M. wore to the S.W. at daylight made sail, latter part equally saw two sails, & ends. Lat by Observation 16.19. South,
Bk. Falcon Rope,	Thursday, February 27 th 1862 Begins with fresh trade, heading S.W. under reefed top sails, & at 3. P.M. spoke the Falcon, and sold her 45 lbs of 3. inch rope at sunset shortened sail, at 4. A.M. wore ship to the South, at daylight made sail, at 8.00 wore to the S.W. saw two sails, latter part squally, & ends. Lat 17.03. S. Long by Obs. 5.26. W.
Fresh trade,	Friday February 28 th 1862 Commenced with fresh trade steered S.W. under reefed top sails, & at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made sail & wore to the S.W. latter part fresh trade saw two sails, & ends. Lat 16.48. S. Long 5.30. West,
