

Ship Plouer, of New Bedford, cruising off  
Bark  
Concordia.  
Saturday, March 1<sup>st</sup> 1862  
Sailed with fresh trade, steered N.E. by E  
under moderate sail, at 4 P.M. spoke  
the Bark, Concordia, of Sagharbours Hammett.  
Master, 34 months out 150 S. and 9 20. N.  
at sunset shortened sail, at daylight  
wore ship to the S.W. and made sail.  
at 9 A.M. spoke the Bark, America,  
latter part moderate, saw the Land, & ends,

Bk. America,  
Bk. Falcon,  
Sunday, March 2<sup>nd</sup> 1862  
Began with moderate trade heading S.W.  
in company with the America, & Falcon,  
at sunset shortened sail, at sunrise made  
sail heading N.E. at 8 A.M. went off towards the  
land, at 9.30 A.M. spoke the Bark Sea Breeze,  
of New Bedford, Steers, Master, 5 months out  
150 S. & ends, the land bearing N.N.W. 10 miles

Bark.  
Sea Breeze,  
Monday, March 3<sup>rd</sup> 1862  
Sailed with fresh trade heading to the S.W.  
in company with the Sea Breeze, at 4 P.M.  
tacked to the N.E. spoke the George & Mary,  
Falcon & Pamela, middle & latter part  
squally, saw the Land & several sails,  
no ends, Land in sight,

Squally,  
Tuesday, March 4<sup>th</sup> 1862  
Sailed with fresh trade & squally heading  
S. S.W. saw three sails, at 5 P.M. wore ship  
to the N.E. at sunset shortened sail, at  
daylight made sail, saw the land & several  
sails, so ends, Lat 16.16. S. Long 5.30. W.

Bk. Falcon,  
Wednesday, March 5<sup>th</sup> 1862  
All these 24 hours fresh trade & some  
squally, shortened & made sail, spoke  
the Falcon, saw the Land & several  
sails, so ends, Lat 16.09. S. Long 5.25. W.

St. Helena, Augustus N. Perkins, Master  
Thursday, March 6<sup>th</sup> 1862  
Fresh trade,  
Began with brisk trade heading East under  
all sail, at sunset shortened sail and tacked  
to the S.W. middle & latter part light winds  
saw several sails, so ends, 16.11. Lat.

Friday, March 7<sup>th</sup> 1862  
Light winds,  
All these 24 hours light baffling winds,  
shortened & made sail, saw several sails,  
and the Land, so ends, Lat 16.26. South

Bk. Mary,  
Saturday, March 8<sup>th</sup> 1862  
Sailed with light baffling winds, at 12.30.  
spoke the Bark Mary, of New Bedford, Thompson,  
Master, 17 months out 240 S. middle & latter  
part some squally, saw 5 sails, so ends,  
Lat 16.30. S.

Bk. Sea Breeze,  
Sunday, March 9<sup>th</sup> 1862  
All these 24 hours light baffling winds with  
some light rain squalls, shortened & made  
sail spoke the Sea Breeze, saw the Land,  
and several sails, so ends, no obs.

A Boat  
ashore,  
Monday, March 10<sup>th</sup> 1862  
Sailed with a moderate breeze from S.E. & E  
heading S.W. under all sail, at sunset  
shortened sail, and wore ship and steered  
North under top sail fore sail & tiller,  
at sunrise kept off for the Harbour, at 9 A.M.  
sent a Boat ashore, at 12 noon the Boat returned,  
so ends with fresh trade,

St. Anchor,  
Tuesday, March 11<sup>th</sup> 1862  
Began with fresh trade, under top sails  
courses &c. at 1 P.M. bent the cables & got  
the anchors off the bows, at 3.40 P.M.  
let go the Larboard Anchor in St Helena  
Harbour in 37 fathoms of water, and paid  
out 50 fathoms of chain, middle & latter part  
flawed, took out the After Hold, sold 4 barrels  
of Rush, so ends,
