Liberty, Sunday, Saturday, April 6th 1862
All these 24 hours light pleasant weather,
No ends, the watch on liberty

Liberty, Monday, April 7th 1862
All these 24 hours fresh trade, and fine
weather, the watch on liberty, No Ends.

Liberty, stopt, Tuesday, April 8th 1862
barn, with fresh trade, all Hands on Board
except the Captain, latter part broke out
for Sails & water, Liberty stopt, latter part
broke trade with a heavy swell, No Ends.

Sober Moleys, Wednesday, April 9th 1862
40 gallons, All these 24 hours brisk trade, bent all
the Studding Sails, sold 40 gallons of Moleys
to the Benjamin Franklin, No Ends.

Ship's men, Thursday, April 10th 1862
Under way, barn, with light trade, all ready for sea
took three men from the Casbah, and shipped
two others, at 12 noon got under way for sea
stowed the Anchors, No Ends, latter part moderate.

Home ward, Friday, April 11th 1862
Bound, Begins with Moderate trade, and fine
weather, at 3.30. the Captain came on board,
and we made all Sail for home, N.W.
Middle & latter part Moderate trade,
cut the Old Fore top Sail up No ends.
Latitude by observation 15.07. South.

Finbacks, Saturday, April 12th 1862
barn, with Moderate trade, under all Sail
stared N.W. by N. middle & latter parts
Moderate wind saw Finbacks, & Porpoises
No Ends, Lat by Obs. 13.58. S. Long. 2.18. W.

Helena, Augustus, N. Perkins, Master.
Sunday, April 13th 1862
barn with Moderate trade, staring N.W. by N.
under all Sails, at 6. A.M. John Holland, saw
sperm whales, lowered all the Boats, and the
Bow Boat struck a whale & dragged another 1/2 at
them both. The Larboard Boats struck & dragged
at 11. took up the Boats, and went to cutting,
No Ends. cutting in, no Obs. latter part
light

Bow Boat, Monday, April 14th 1862
Cutting, barn, with moderate trade and good weather,
at 3.17. P.M. finished cutting, at 4. P.M.
Commenced boiling, heading to the Eastward,
at daylight wore ship to the S.W. and
made more Sail latter part moderate,
employed in boiling, No Ends. Lat 18.59. South

Boiling, Tuesday, April 15th 1862
Boiling, Begins with Moderate trade heading S.W.,
boiling, at 2.20. P.M. John Brown, saw a spout
three times, run for it and lay aback 1/2 hours
saw nothing more of it, kept off North and
made Sail, at daylight finished boiling,
drunked off. No Ends. Lat 18.00. S.

Boiling, Wednesday, April 16th 1862
Boiling, barn, with fresh trade, stared S.W. W. under
all Sail, at 8. A.M. Henry Baker, saw sperm
whales, at 9. A.M. lowered all the Boats, and
three struck, the Bow Boat
got two the Waist Boat
and and the Larboard Boat
lost her whale, by the line
getting cut, at 11.30. got
the Whales along side and, Waist Boat
got dinner, No Ends.
