 came with strong trade steered N.W. by N. &
 N.W. by N. with fore & main top gallant sails
 out & flying jib, middle & latter part
 squally. Saw a sail. So ends, Lat 22. 19. N. 33. 11.

Throughout these 24 hours fresh trade & fine
weather, steered N. W. by N. under all sail, stood
down the oil, & winds. Lat 24. 37. N. Long 55. 00.

Van a Brig. So ends. Lat 28. 08. N. Long 60. 20. W.

Thursday, May, 29th 1862
Sailed with a fresh breeze from S. by E and
stormy weather, steered N. W. by S. under all
sail except on the Mizzen. Middle part the wind
freshed to S. W. and howled strong with heavy
rain, shortened sail, latter part light wind
from N. W. Ran a sail. So ends. Lat 33. 37. N
Longitude by Chronometer, 63. 40. W
