The fore part of this day begins with light breezes steering N.W. at 6 shortened sail at 6 P.M. Point D. Auger bore N.W. dist 7 leagues light breezes through the Night breezes through the stored S.W. at 6 P.M. saw Day's Head latter part brisk breeze

Sunday June 22<sup>nd</sup> 1834

The fore part of this day begins with brisk breezes at 2 P.M. came to in 12 fathoms water with the West Mower light airs through at 4 P.M. hove up and Warped further in to the let go the anchor in 9 fathoms water the Starboard watch on liberty

Monday June 23<sup>rd</sup> 1834

The fore part light breezes at 6 the liberty men returned from the Shore light airs through the Night latter part fresh breeze watch one shore on liberty the other watch Employed in painting ship

Tuesday June 24<sup>th</sup> 1834

The fore part of this day begins with brisk breezes at 6 the liberty men returned on board light airs through the Night at 8 P.M. one watch on shore on liberty the other Employed in painting Ship Carpenter Employed in painting the Starboard watch on liberty

Wednesday June 25<sup>th</sup> 1834

Begins with light breezes Employed in painting Ship at 6 the Starboard Watch returned on board light airs through the Night at 8 the harbour watch on liberty the Starboard watch on the others Employed in painting at 6

Thursday June 26<sup>th</sup> 1834

Begins with light breezes Employed in painting at 6 the watch returned on board at 5 P.M. one watch a shore on liberty the other watch Employed in painting ship at 6

Friday June 27<sup>th</sup> 1834

Begins with light breezes Employed in painting ship at 6 P.M. the watch returned on board light breezes through the Night at 8 P.M. the 8 one half the ships company went ashore on liberty

Saturday June 28<sup>th</sup> 1834

Begins with light breezes Employed in painting ship at 6 P.M. the watch returned on board at 11 P.M. John Mores, Robert Foster, Jonas G. Andrews, Archibald MacAlister, Lawrence D. Clark, Made an attempt to leave the Ship in the Main Mast with their clothes John Mores at their head.
