

Thursday July 17. 1834
begins with light breezes steering
N.W. at 6. shortened sail and headed
up shore with main sail aback saw a
school of Whales supposed to be sperm whales
latter part light breezes steering S.W. S.
W. about 10 miles from the land

Friday July 18. 1834
begins with light breezes from S.W.
steering down by the land at 6. luffed to with
the main sail aback headed of shore
latter part light breezes steered back and forth

Saturday July 19. 1834
begins with light breezes at 3. AM
spoke the Bark Ship Minerva New Bedford
Capt. Wick 14. M. out 4.00 AM. light breezes and
calm through the night at 8. took a breeze
stood in shore in company with Ship Minerva
saw blackfish

Sunday July 20. 1834
begins with light airs standing
in for the North Head at 4. tacked off
light air and calm through the night latter part
calm ships in sight

Monday July 21. 1834
The fore part of this day begins
with light air standing in to the bay
latter part light breezes. Lat by Ob. 1. 36. N

Tuesday July 22. 1834
begins with light breezes standing
in to the North Head at 4. tacked off shore
latter part light air standing in for the North
head Lat by Ob. 1. 36. N

Wednesday July 23. 1834
The fore part of this day begins
with light air standing in to for the North head
latter part light air at 10. AM. lay aback of
the North head about 4 miles from the shore
sent one boat in to catch fish

Thursday July 24. 1834
The fore part of this day begins
with light air from N.W. at 2. AM. Boat
returned with fish & stood off to the N.W.
light air and calm through the night lay
back latter part light breezes steered S.W.

Lat - 1. 36. N
Long - 91. 36. W
Friday July 25. 1834
The fore part of this day begins with
light breezes from S.W. steering S.W.
at midnight lay by at 4. AM. steered N.W. at 6. AM
saw sperm whales at 8. lowered at 9. struck a large
whale the fore draw at 10. took up the whale
and chased with the ship

Saturday July 26. 1834
The fore part of this day begins with
light breezes from S.W. at 2. AM. lowered and
chained to forward at 4. struck the fore draw
at 5. took up the whale and cleaved down the
topside calm at 4. AM. made sail steered East
at 6. AM. saw whales at 8. lowered and struck two
whales & drew from them and pursued on after
the school at 11. struck a small whale and a
large one drew from the small one
killed the large whale
Culper Island in sight Lat by Ob. 1. 36. N
Long - 92. 16. W

Sunday January 27. 1834
The fore part of this day begins with
light breezes and thick weather at 1. AM
got the whale made fast to the ship at 3. AM
comm. cutting at 6. AM. lashed down at 8. AM. finished
cutting the body latter part brisk breezes latter part
Long - 92. 31

Monday January 28. 1834
The fore part of this day begins with
brisk breezes at 2. finished cutting at 5. comm. boiling
latter part brisk breezes employed in boiling
cutting up the carcass Lat by Ob. 1. 36. N
Long - 91. 50
