Wednesday Sept 10th 1834

The fore part of this day begins with light breezes steered N.E. at 4. 30. spoke the ship Mosco of New Bedford 15. 16. out 1200 Mls. latter part light breezes. spoke the L.C. Richmond. Lat by Obs. 00. 28. 1. Long 91. 32

Thursday Sept 11th 1834

The fore part of this day begins with light breezes steered East with a current setting to the S. West latter part fresh breezes Abington Island in sight strong current setting S. West at 4. 30. Abington Island at 10 miles Long by Obs. 90. 52. 4

Friday Sept 12th 1834

The fore part of this day begins with fresh breezes standing to the Eastward latter part fresh breezes showery. Lat by Obs. 00. 53. 1. Abington Island in sight. Long by Obs. 90. 25

Saturday Sept 13th 1834

The fore part of this day begins with strong breezes from S.E. latter part strong breezes. Lat by Obs. 1. 22. 1. Long by Obs. 88. 14

Sunday Sept 14th 1834

The fore part of this day begins with light breezes latter part fresh breezes and showers saw finbacks Blackfish porpoises &c. Lat by Obs. 1. 26. 1. Long by Obs. 87. 02. 1

Monday Sept 15th 1834

The fore part of this day begins with moderate breezes and showery latter part fresh breezes. Lat by Obs. 00. 20. 1. Long " 86. 58. 1

Tuesday Sept 16th 1834

The fore part of this day begins with fresh breezes from N.E. latter part light breezes. Lat by Obs. 01. 08. 1. Long " 85. 08. 1

Wednesday Sept 17th 1834

The fore part of this day begins with light breezes from S.E. at 4. 30. saw a sperm whale lowered the boats in pursuit saw nothing more of the whale at 6. took up the Monts stood to the Westward at 11. tacked to the Eastward latter part light breezes two ships in sight. Lat by Obs. 00. 27. 1. Long " 84. 24

Thursday Sept 18th 1834

The fore part of this day begins with light breezes from South latter part light breezes pleasant. Lat by Obs. 00. 29. 1. Long by Obs. 83. 31. 1

Friday Sept 19th 1834

The fore part of this day begins with light breezes from S.W. latter part light breezes strong current setting to the S.E. Lat by Obs. 1. 30. 1. Long by Obs. 82. 24. 1

Saturday Sept 20th 1834

The fore part of this day begins with light breezes at 4. 30. spoke the ship Messenger of New Bedford 27. out 1200 Mls. stood to the Westward at 11. tacked ship latter part moderate. Lat by Obs. 1. 50. 1. Long " 82. 00. 1

Sunday Sept 21th 1834

The fore part begins with light breezes at 2. 30. saw a large whale lowered in pursuit saw nothing more of the whale latter part light breezes at 11. 46. saw the Land Wren N.E. dist. 30 miles. Long by Obs. 81. 02. 1. Lat by Obs. 2. 46. 1
