

Thursday February 12th 1835

The fore part of this day begins with light breezes latter part light breezes Lat 11° 12' Long 82° 50'

Friday February 13

The fore part of this day begins with moderate breezes latter part moderate Lat by Obs. 11° 05' Long by Chs. 83° 05'

Saturday February 14

The fore part of this day begins with light air latter part light air Lat 11° 02' Long 82° 55'

Sunday February 15

The fore part comes with light air and showers latter part fresh breezes Lat 11° 00' Long by Chs. 82° 57'

Monday February 16

The fore part of this day begins with fresh breezes latter part light breezes Lat 11° 20' Long 82° 22'

Tuesday February 17

The fore part of this day begins with light breezes latter part light breezes Lat by Obs. 11° 15' Long by Chs. 81° 44'

Wednesday February 18

The fore part of this day begins with light breezes at 4 AM spoke the ship May Flower New Bedford 4 months 4 days from New Bedford. Lat by Obs. 11° 00' Long by Chs. 81° 05'

Thursday February 19

The fore part of this day begins with light breezes latter part brisk breezes Lat 11° 39' Long by Chs. 79° 19'

Friday February 20

The fore part of this day begins with brisk breezes latter part light breezes and foggy Lat 11° 15' Long 79° 00'

Saturday February 21 1835

The fore part of this day begins with light breezes foggy at 1 AM spoken to the ship at 4 AM the fog lifted said the land dist 10 miles latter part light breezes foggy (V.S.) Obs.

Sunday February 22

begins with light breezes standing on for the land at 5 AM were round and lay to back at 10 AM spoke the ship Rifle Capt. Peck 6 months out 10 AM at 4 AM were round steered in for the land Employed in getting up the chains getting the anchor of the ship out

Monday February 23

The fore part of this day begins with light breezes at Meridian came two in 9 fathoms water in Guadamaray Bay

Tuesday February 24

Came with moderate breezes Employed in getting off water at 5 AM hove up the anchor and warped further in to the harbour let go the anchor in 5 fathoms water at 8 AM the Starboard watch went on shore on liberty at 6 AM they returned all except Clark and Henry Cutbush

Wednesday February 25

Came with light breezes the Starboard watch Employed in blacking the guns getting off pumpkins at 6 AM the Starboard watch returned Evening (Henry Cutbush and Lawrence D. Clark which had deserted) at 8 AM the Starboard watch on shore on liberty

Thursday February 26

Came with light breezes Employed in getting off food potatoes pumpkins &c. at 2 AM the Spaniards brought Lawrence D. Clark and Henry Cutbush down to the beach in prison and took them on board at 4 AM 4 of the Starboard watch returned. James S. Andrews A. G.
