Thursday Oct. 1. Long. 157° 30'
begins with strong breezes at 2 P.M. saw
the Island of Mangeca at 4 double reefed the
topsails and braced by the wind to the South
the Island bearing West dist 20 Miles at Midnight
tacked the North at 10 AM kept off for the Island

Friday Oct. 2
begins with strong breezes rising
at 3 P.M. got down under the lee of the Island
and sent a Boat in at sunset the Boat returned
on board strong breezes squally through the night
at 9 AM the Boat went on shore

Saturday Oct. 3
begins with strong breezes squally
Employed in getting off planks strong breezes
through the night at 11 AM discharged John Fisher
in consequence of ill health latter part strong
strong breezes squally steers West

Sunday October 4. 1835
begins with strong breezes steering N.W. by S.
at 6 AM double reef the topsails braced by the
wind to the North at 3 AM Made sail steered N.W.
at 8 AM saw the Island of Curute bearing S.W. by S.
dist 30 Miles dist
Lat By Obs. 21° 27'
Long 159° 42'

Monday Oct. 5
begins with light breezes from N.E.
steering S.W. by W. at 5 AM braced by the wind at 5 AM got down
and off for the Island at 10 AM got down and
landed on the E.S.E. side of the Island in
pursuit of Pigs Henry Kibb, Henry Durr Black,
Archibald Macalaster, and Samuel Brown ran
from the Boat

Tuesday Oct. 6
begins with brisk breezes at 4 P.M.
got 4 Natives to take the Boat on Board
took off 5 hogs Natives in sack of the men latter
part strong breezes squally attended with Thunder
and Lightning

Wednesday Oct. 7
begins with fresh breezes showery
Ship laying off and on the Island
at 10 AM the Boat came on shore on the S.W.
side of the Island Natives in sack of the Boat

Thursday Oct. 8
begins with pleasant weather Ship
laying off and the Island Natives in sack
of the Boat

Friday Oct. 9
begins with fresh breezes rising at 6 AM
the Boat returned on board the Ship Middle
and latter part strong breezes

Saturday Oct. 10
begins with fresh breezes at 2 AM steered
in to the South at Midnight tacked to the N.E.
latter part fresh breezes at 11 tacked to the
South the Island in sight Lat By Obs. 20° 47'
