 begins with light breezes from North
 latter part calm Lat. 23° 14' N
 Long. 178° 31' 30" W

Friday Sept. 2.
 comm. with trade weather light breezes
 through the night at 7 AM saw Whales 5 miles
 of 3 points on the weather bore at 9 lowered
 at 11 struck and killed one Whale & boards
 ferried on after the shoal Lat. 23° 26' N
 Long. 178° 25' W

Saturday Sept. 3.
 begins with brisk breezes
 at 3 P.M. struck and killed another Whale
 at 6 got them made fast to the ship
 at 6 comm. cutting latter part squally
 Lat. 23° 25' N
 Long. 178° 45' W

Sunday Sept. 4.
 begins with light breezes at 1 P.M. finished
 cutting at 4 comm. bailing latter part fresh breeze
 Lat. 22° 55' N
 Long. 178° 52' W

Monday Sept. 5.
 begins with light breezes from N.E. at 8 P.M.
 finished bailing latter part light breezes
 Lat. 23° 14' N
 Long. 179° 04' W

Tuesday Sept. 6.
 begins with brisk breezes from E.N.E.
 latter part light breezes Lat. 24° 09' N
 Long. 179° 14' W

Wednesday Sept. 7. 1836
 begins with light breezes from E.N.E.
 latter part brisk breezes Lat. 24° 21' N
 Long. 179° 20' W

Thursday Sept. 8.
 begins with brisk breezes from East
 at 8 AM saw Whales lowered and chased them
 to windward Whales going to fast to windward
 at Macedonian took up the boats Lat. 24° 13' N
 Long. 179° 15' W

Friday Sept. 9.
 begins with brisk breezes from E.N.E.
 latter part light breezes showery Lat. 24° 29' N
 Long. 179° 20' W

Saturday Sept. 10.
 begins with light breezes from N.E. & E.
 latter part calm Lat. 24° 20' N
 Long. 179° 15' W

Sunday Sept. 11.
 begins with light airs from N.E.
 latter part light airs from S.W. steering East
 Lat. 24° 22' N
 Long. 178° 56' W

Monday Sept. 12.
 begins with light airs from S.W. steering
 East latter part calm Lat. 24° 26' N
 Long. 178° 50' W

Tuesday Sept. 13.
 begins with light airs from South
 middle and latter part calm Lat. 24° 25' N
 Long. 178° 50' W

Wednesday Sept. 14.
 begins with light airs from N.E. at 3 AM
 saw Whales lowered and chased at sunset
 gave up the chase returned on board
 at 7 AM saw Whales at 8 lowered and struck
 and two Whales killed one seen from
 the other Lat. 24° 32' N
 Long. 178° 45' W
