the E & S delivered to the Sapphia
Shannon 3 bbls of flour & 15 gallons of
molasses passed all day middle
& latter part strong winds so ends
the day

183 days Remarks Wednesday April 15th
first part of
these 24 hours strong winds & very
rough from the S ship heading by
the wind to the W & W middle
& latter parts calms employed
fitting the blacks masts

184 days Remarks Thursday April 16th
first part of
these 24 hours light winds
& calms from the S & W ship
heading to the S & E at 6 P.M.
took in sail & veered ship
middle & latter parts very
much the same

185 days Remarks Friday April 17th
first part
of these 24 hours light winds
& calms middle & latter parts
very much the same employed
fitting blocks

Cruising off French Rocks

186 days Remarks Saturday April 18th
first part of
these 24 hours light winds & calms
middle & latter parts very much
the same so so ends the day

187 days Remarks Sunday April 19th
first part of
these 24 hours light winds from
the W ship heading by the
wind to the S at 4 P.M. both
the ships Swift & Burnham
took in sail latter part veered
ship to the N.W. so ends the day

188 days Remarks Monday April 20th
first part
of these 24 hours light winds from
the W ship heading by the wind to
the N.W. middle part the same
latter part made sail so ends
the day employed reefing the fore
topsail

189 days Remarks Tuesday April 21st
first part of
these 24 hours strong winds & squally
from the N.W. at 2 P.M. two
reefs & furl the fore topsail so ends
with French Rocks bearing N.W. by
middle part the same latter part
at 6 P.M. bent the fore topsail
& veered ship to the N.W.
middle & latter part very
much the same employed
reefing the fore topsail
