Remarks Monday Aug 17th

first part of these 24 hours strong winds & very raged from the ESE at 3 steering for River Island at 3 saw a school of sperm whales lowered but the whales going to windward & it being so raged there was but a very little change & no success this day middle part heading off shore latter part at 8 M. weerd ship & stood in for River I at 11 P.M. the natives came off with a few coconuts & many apples and there an hour & then steard off S.E. & so ends

Remarks Tuesday Aug 18th

first part of these 24 hours strong winds & plenty of rain from the S ship heading by the wind to the WNW to day spotted the main topsail yard it having been sprung alto found the head of fore topmast badly rotten middle & latter parts very much the same so ends

Remarks Wednesday Aug 19th

first part of these 24 hours strong winds & very raged from the ESE ship heading by the wind to the S at 2 A.M. I took the ship Baraboo middle part the same latter part at 7 P.M. weerd ship to the S.E. so ends the day Aug 18. 22

Remarks Thursday Aug 20th

first part of these 24 hours strong winds & very raged from the E ship heading N.W. at 1 A.M. took ship to the S.E. & two up the fore topsail middle & latter parts very much the same so ends the day

Remarks Friday August 21st

first part of these 24 hours light winds & very raged from the ESE ship heading by the wind to the S.E. middle part the same latter part at 8 P.M. ordered the mate to get up some sineth to get mark on one Portquin by the name of John Firth did not move. I then went forward to see the reason mil he said I in an insubstant manner there was a man gone after that I ordered him to go & help he refused & I tried to make him go he then struck at me several times Capt. Macy there upon came to my assistance more upon the said firth got all of Capt. Macy by the neck & scratched his face in every bad manner. John firth then told us that Manuel firth came to his assistance Manuel firth could not get at the gangway for all the Portins to come up & fight in & give the officers & Captain a trashing but no body came but Manuel firth were upon Mr. Craft kept him & they ad to back down Capt. Macy ordered them to be put in the rig & he flayed them & put them in irons. They then begged off & said they would not resist again. were upon the orders then out of France & go to duty so ends the day
