day Rock bearing N. E. distance 15 miles

first part of
these 24 hours light winds from
the N. ship heading to the S. W. middle
& latter part the same Sailor & Williams
still confined

562th day Remarks Monday May 2nd

first part light
winds & drizely from the N. ship heading
S. W. at 2 M light two heading W. M. at 6 P.M.
hecket to the S. E. & shortened sail
middle & latter parts very much the
same & ends the day

563th day Remarks Tuesday May 3rd

first part of
these 24 hours strong winds from
the S. E. ship heading to the S. E.
at 6 M made sail on the ship at
7 M saw French Rock bearing N. W. M.
distance 15 miles & ends Williams &
Sailor still confined

564th day Remarks Wednesday May 4th

first part
strong winds every way from the
N. E. ship heading S. E. at 1 M opened
the Alabama at 4 M weard to the S. E.
shortened sail middle & latter parts
very much the same & ends Williams &
Sailor still confined in irons

565th day Remarks Thursday May 5th

first part of
these 24 hours strong winds from the
S. ship heading to the S. at 6 M weard ship
to the N. E. pulled the fore sail mainly
part at 4 M weard ship again to the S. E.
at 7 A.M. saw French Rock bearing S. E.
distance 5 miles Sailor & Williams still
confined & ends the day
