first part
strong winds from the S ship working
up to the Anchorage at 1st came too in
6 fathoms of water middle part the same
latter part at 7th coming sailing down
the foretopmast so ends

584^{dy} Remarks Tuesday May 24th

first part
employed sending down the fore topmast
also employed making another to send up
middle latter part very much the
same so ends the day

585^{dy} Remarks Wednesday May 25th

first employed
making a topmast at 5th found
two men missing by the name of
Thomas Locking & John Brudely
so ends the day

586^{dy} Remarks Thursday May 26th

first part
employed making the topmast
also scraping the ships deck works
to day a mother man directed by the name
of Peter Molay at 4 sent up the
fore topmast so ends the day

first part
employed staying the fore topmast
latter part the same so ends the day
received one bag of rice

588^{dy} Remarks Saturday May 28th

this day employed
scraping & painting ship latter part
the same so ends the day

to day the
starboard watch went on liberty so ends the
day

590^{dy} Remarks Monday May 30th

first part
employed scraping & painting to day received
on board 4 bbls of sweet potatoes & 200 so
pankings also one bag of rice so ends the
day

591^{dy} Remarks Tuesday May 31st

first part
blowing from the W with plenty of rain
nothing doing

592^{dy} Remarks Wednesday June 1st

first part employed
scraping & painting latter part the same
received from S. Stevenson 12 sheets of
copper & 5 mails & one Quarter of beef

593^{dy} Remarks Thursday June 2^d

first part
employed painting latter part at 4th All
hoisted up the Anchor to and on the bank
so as to put on some copper but
could not get on for a week at to be
till next tide employed for taking on shore
water cups & filling them so ends
