first part

water so ends the day

595th Remarks Saturday June 4th

first part
employed painting & getting off water
& stowing it down also got off one
boat loads of wood delivered on shore the
empty barrels & 10 empty casks also delivered
on board the Alabama two casks of
specimen oil

596th Remarks Sunday June 5th

first part
employed getting off wood & water to day
one man by the name of Bernus a
native of Australia deserted also
slide for his discharge Mr Craft 3rd officer
at 7 all hands went on liberty & all
came off again but William Thompson
& Edmund Moody remain the day

597th Remarks Monday June 6th

got off all the
wood & water & commencing getting ready
for sea so ends the day

598th Remarks Tuesday June 7th

commenced with
strong winds & rain from the S.W. employed
clearing up & getting ready for sea
latter part mustered all hands & found
one more man missing by the name of
James Mann at 4 P.M. discharged Mr Craft the
3rd officer also one Boatsteward by the name of
Frank Dwyer remain the day

599th Remarks Wednesday June 8th

first part
employed searching the schooner Selfish
for runaways but could not find any
latter part got the Arkansas master come on
board & shifted the ship out into the stream
so ends the day

600th Remarks Thursday June 9th

first part
light winds from the N.W. at 12 M.
the pilot came on board to get the ship
on the way also received on board two
deserters Thomas Larking & John Breckin
took the anchor & stood out to sea
left the pilot of the Black Rocks & moved
N.E. & middle part hauled the main top
sail with a sparker latter part the same

601th Remarks Friday June 10th

first part
strong winds from the S.W. ship heading
N.W. & middle & latter part the same so ends
the day
Lat 33° 14' N
Long 176° 24' E

602th Remarks Saturday June 11th

first part
strong winds & squalls from the S.W. steering
N.W. & under two reefs middle & latter
part very much the same so ends the day

603th Remarks Sunday June 12th

first part of
these 24 hours strong winds from the S.W.
steering off N.W. & middle part the same
latter part at 6 P.M. saw Sunday Island
bearing 6 miles distance & hauled at 9 P.M.
more moderate set the whale main top
& main top gall sail & ends the day
Lat 28° 46' N
