 to the officer of the watch against the Cook
 for being turned in with the Boy & the name
 of Burgess. I then called them both out
 & asked the cook what he was doing there he
 said I was feeling for oranges & that I was not
 in the birth he John North & I then
 said they saw him getting out of the birth
 he cook then said he was not planning any
 plans in there I then asked Burgess how
 many times he had been there he said twice
 before I then put the cook in irons & kept
 him there till the capt. came off & sent
 the latter part received on board
 3 boat loads of fruit & so ends

he told him that because there for the sole
 purpose of committing adultery Capt. Stacy
 then called the cook & told him to pack
 up his things go in a shore put him into
 one of the shore boats & he set him on shore

 winds from the S by E at 4 M got up one
 boat load of wood middle part being off
 & on latter part the same & ends the day

618^{dp} Remarks Monday June 27th
 first part strong
 winds from the S by E ship being off & on
 middle part the same latter part got off
 3 boat loads of wood & ends the day

618^{dp} Remarks Monday June 28th
 first part strong
 winds from the S by E ship being off & on
 received on board 4 boat loads of wood also
 some foul bananas & bread fruit latter part
 got off 4 boat loads of wood & some recruits
 in the shape of fowl & bananas also 2nd boat
 loads of coconuts & ends the day
