Aug with light winds from the E a heaving
to the S W at 4 A.M. took and spoke
the barque Sarah of New Bedford at sun down
took in sail and steered W at day light
strong winds the vessel in sight so ends
Lat 39.44 Long 41.11

Aug
Tuesdaynd These 24 hours commences
with strong winds from the S E with squalls
of rain at sun down took in sail and
hauled sharp by to the S at day light strong
winds with squalls of rain a sail a sturn
of us in ends all well
Lat 49.30 Long 37.30

Wednesdayrd These 24 hours commences
with strong winds from the S E a
heaving sharp by to the S W thick and raining
middle and latter part the same latter part
strong winds a heaving by the wind
Lat 57.44 Long 42.20

Thursdayth These 24 hours commen
with the winds more moderate a
heaving to the S W saw a number
of fin backs and a piece of an old
rook at sun down took in sail
middle part fine at day light set all
sail a heaving to the S W so ends
Lat 37.07 Long 43.00

Fridayth These 24 hours commences
with light winds from the S
at 5 A.M. spoke the Sarah and the
Gannet of N Bedford middle and
latter part fine employed in various gobs
Lat 36.30 Long 43.40

Saturdayth These 24 hours commences
with light winds from the S W a heaving
to the S E employed in breaking ought
for water and provisions at sun down
loosed down to practice our crew at day
light steered of S at 8 P.M. saw black fish
loosed three boats but with ought success
Lat 36.07 Long 44.30

Aug 1865
Sundayth These 24 hours commences
with light winds from the S a steering
S E employed in various gobs at
sun down put ought the bar boat and
took in sail heaving to the N E
at day light set sail winds from
the N E latter part calms
Lat 36.02 Long 44.17

Mondayst These 24 hours commences
with calms at 5 light winds from the
N E a heaving to the E carried all sail
middle and latter part fine winds from the
S a steering E N E employed in various
gobs loosed down and caught a turtle
Lat 36.04 Long 42.17

Tuesdaynd These 24 hours commences
with light winds from the S a steering
E N E middle part fine latter part
the same employed in various gobs
about the ship so ends
Lat 36.40 Long 40.07

Wednesdayrd These 24 hours commences
with light winds from the S
a steering N N E at 6 A.M. saw black
fish loosed but with ought success
middle and latter part calms
Lat 37.20 Long 40.07
