Sunday³¹ These 24 hours commences with light winds from the S a strong N.W. the land in sight at 6 p.m. spoke the ship Rain bow of N Bedford middle part calms at day light set sail winds light from the E and stood in shore at 8 a.m. spoke the barque Mary & Susan of N B at 10 a.m. spoke the barque Saffo N B latter part fine

1866 Lat 44.51 L 75.48

Monday¹ These 24 hours commences with light winds from the E a standing off shore at 4 p.m. steered of W.S.W. middle part strong winds took in light sail latter part rainy winds hauled to the S.E. doubled reefed the topsails

Lat 45.00 L 77.42

Tuesday² These 24 hours commences with calms at 2 p.m. light winds from the W set sail a heading to the N.W. saw a sail bound to the N middle part fine latter part winds hauled to the N.W. or ship

Lat 44.27 L 77.40

Wednesday³ These 24 hours commences with light winds from the N a heading to the W middle part fine latter part the same so ends

Lat 44.43 L 77.40

Thursday⁴ These 24 hours commences with light winds from the W took the ship to the N employed in a few jobs about the ship middle part fine latter part the same

Lat 43.06 L

Friday⁵ 1866

These 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the W a strong N employed in bending royals and standing sails at 4 p.m. wind hauled to the S middle part the same latter part steered N.E.

Lat 40.36 L 77.30

Saturday⁶ These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the S a strong N.E. by N middle part strong winds at 9 p.m. saw the island of Nochea at 20 miles latter part more wind took in standing sails and doubled reefed so ends

Sunday⁷ These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the S a strong N.W. the land at 2 p.m. the capt went on shore at 5 returned employed in getting the anchors ready stowed in at 8 p.m. anchored one mile from the shore in 9 fathoms of water middle part strong gales from the S at day light got breakfast and towed in a raft of eight pipes to fill with water

Monday⁸ These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the S.E. first part towed of the raft of water and hauled it in and stowed it below middle part fine latter part employed in getting of wood and water men

Tuesday⁹ These 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the S employed in getting of potatoes and wood ~~for~~ thirty eight lbs of potatoes and three 7 foot loads of wood to men deserted one William Briggs at 7 p.m. took one anchor and steered N.W. middle part light winds latter part employed in stowing the anchors
