

Tuesday¹⁰ These 24 hours commenced April with moderate winds from the E a steering N^W middle part fine latter part saw a bark bound to the E employed in making boat sails

Lat 34.14 L 171.14

Wednesday¹¹ These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S E a steering N^W middle part winds halled to S latter part employed in setting up the loar rigging no ends

Lat 36.19 Long 171.10

Thursday¹² These 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the S^W a steering N^W employed in setting up rigging took in light sail and wore ship and set up the other side middle part more wind doubled reefed the topsails latter part halled the gill and main sail no ends

Lat 39.00 L 173.20

Friday¹³ These 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the W^SW a steering N^W at 2 p.m. clost reefed the topsails and furled the four sail and a halling to the N^W middle part winds halled to the N^W and moderated latter part wore ship a heading to the W winds light no ends

Lat 39.21 L 173.4

Saturday¹⁴ These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S a steering N^W middle part rising and strong winds latter part moderate and befling with rain no ends

Lat 40.36 L 174.22

Sunday¹⁵ Apr These 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the N a heading to the W middle part reefed topsails middle part more moderate winds halled to the N^W wore ship to the W latter part winds from the N E no ends

Monday¹⁶ These 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the N E a steering N^W middle part winds more to the N latter part calms no ends

Lat 41.50 L 176.70

Tuesday¹⁷ These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S a steering N^W employed in the bending a main top garrison and four sail and sent down the main topsail and mended it and bent it again latter part strong winds from the S^W latter part rising no ends this day

Lat 44.04 L 179.11

Wednesday¹⁸ These 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the S^W a steering N^W at sundown winds halled to the N^W and the heavy took in all sail exceptin clost reefed main topsail latter part squally with hail

Lat 45.14 L 179.11 E

Thursday¹⁹ These 24 hours commenced with a strong gale from the N^W a heading to the N at 4 p.m. more moderate set the four topsail middle part the same latter part heavy squalls

Lat 46.02 L 177.8
