Saturday 21 These 24 hours commences with a strong gale from the N^W a heading to the N under short sail latter part heavy squalls of wind and hail one boat steered sight

Lat 47° 00'

Sunday 22 These 24 hours it continues to blow from the ^W a heading to the N middle part winds more moderate latter part winds from the S steering ^W N^W winds light

Monday 23 These 24 hours commences with light winds from the S a steering ^W N^W middle part strong winds and a heavy sea a running latter part all hands employed in starting water and provisions winds light

Tuesday 24 These 24 hours commences with light winds from the E and foggy middle part winds N^W a steering sharp by to the ^W latter part calms so ends

Lat 49° 36' S 175° 30' 00"

Wednesday 25 These 24 hours fresh winds from the S a steering ^W middle part strong winds latter part winds backed to the S ^W

Lat 50° 03' S

Thursday 25 These 24 hours commences with strong gale from the S ^W a heading to the ^W under close reefed topsails and reefed main sail middle part the same latter part more moderate set all sail

Lat 50 Long

Saturday 26 These 24 hours commences with light baffling winds with snow at 4 p.m. a strong breeze springing up from the N a heading to the west middle part winds backed our ship to the S ^W latter part our ship to the N strong winds with squalls

Lat 51° 11' Long

Sunday 27 These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the ^W a heading to the N middle part winds from the S a steering ^W by N latter part saw Copper island dist twenty miles east of N^W ^W so ends some foggy Copper island

April Lat 54° 13'

Monday 30 These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the S a steering down by Copper island latter part strong winds shortened sail a steering N^W

May Lat 56° 04'

Tuesday 1 of May These 24 hours commences with light winds from the S ^W a steering N^W no ice in sight latter part at 10 a.m. saw the ice and land latter part winds light

Lat 57° 50' Long

Wednesday 2 These 24 hours commences with light baffling a steering a long the ice land dist 40 miles middle part winds baffling latter part light winds from the E a heading of to the S thick fog so ends
