Sunday 6 These 24 hours commences with light winds and a thick fog first part tacked to the S.E. middle part the 1. strong winds took in light sail and doubled reefed the topsails and wor ship to the N.E. at day light clear saw the land dist 20 miles wind moderate

Monday 7 May These 24 hours commences with light baffling winds and clear land dist 15 miles rounded and got 45 fathoms of water white and black sand the middle part winds light latter part a steering down a long the land to the S. so ends

Wednesday 9 These 24 hours commences with light winds from the W. a steering N.E. land dist 10 miles part calms latter part saw three sails

Thursday 10 These 24 hours commences with calms land dist 10 miles middle part calms at 4 A.M. wind sprung up from the E. with snow stood in and tacked of shore latter part strong winds took in light sail one hup in sight so ends.

Friday 11 These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the S. a beeting up a long the shore at 5 p.m. spoke the back Routlines of N Bedford from the S. islands middle part moderate winds latter part more wind from the N.E. a heddin in shore took in light sail and doubled reefed the topsails and halled the main sail so ends

Saturday 12 These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the S. a heddin of shore at 5 p.m. took in full strong winds with snow the Routlines in sight middle part took in the foresail latter part wor ship in shore thick and snow and very cold
