winds halled to the W. Steered N.E.

Tuesday¹⁵ There 24 hours commenced
with light winds from the W. & steering
N.E. land dist 30 miles middle part
winds light & halling to the E. latter part
winds from the S.E. with snow & wind.

Wednesday¹⁶ There 24 hours commenced
with light winds from the S.E. & steering
N.E. first part saw the ice stand in and
tacked off at 5 pm to the S.E.
middle part strong winds and a snowing
latter part a blowing heavy took in all sail
except clost reefed main topsail & wench

Thursday¹⁷ There 24 hours commenced
with a gale from the N.W. & lying of land
on the ice & snowing hard and very cold
latter part the same saw some cattering
pieces of ice vor ship to the West

Friday¹⁸ May There 24 hours it continues
to blow a gale of wind from the N. with
snow the watch employed in steering it of
deck ship & hudding to the N.W. under clost reefed
main topsail saw some drift ice middle
part more moderate set some sail
latter part fine saw the land and three
sails so ends

Saturday¹⁹ There 24 hours commenced
with light winds from the E. & hudding
in shore at 4 pm spuck the ship
Reindeer middle part strong winds
latter part saw several ships & standing
in to the E. so ends

Sunday²⁰ There 24 hours commenced
with strong winds from the N. & hudding
to the N.E. saw some ice middle part
strong winds & land snow latter part
latter part a beating to the windward
ice and land in sight

Monday²¹ There 24 hours commenced
with strong winds from the N.E.
and snow & beating up & long the land
middle part snow at 4 pm steered off to
the E. & long the land saw two sails
