part a thick fog latter part the
same so ends this day

Thursday 12th There 24 hours commences
with light winds and a thick fog
& heading in to the N first part
got in six fathom of water cast anchor
middle part the same
latter part calms and foggy so ends

Friday 13th There 24 hours commences
with light winds from the S
and cleared up some saw the land
dust two miles covered a way two boats
and went on shore and got wood
latter part the natives on board

Saturday 14th There 24 hours light
winds from the E & heading
at anchor boats on shore working
at 1 p.m. strong winds called the boats
in board took care anchor and
steered W by S the watch employed
in splitting up wood middle and
latter part rainy so ends

Sunday 15th There 24 hours commences
with strong winds from the S & steering
W N W middle part the same
latter part more moderate and clear
so ends this day

Monday July 16th There 24 hours
commences with strong winds from
the S & steering by the wind to the
S W saw two sails middle part
saw a whale & going quick to the N
latter part more moderate

Tuesday 17th There 24 hours commences
with moderate winds & steering to
the N W & long the ice middle part
saw a whale hoared two boats but with
ought success latter part rainy

Wednesday 18th There 24 hours
commences with light winds from the
N & steering & long the ice middle
part spoke the ship Ocean
latter part fine

Thursday 19th There 24 hours
commences with moderate winds
from the N & steering & long the
ice to the S middle part saw
twenty ships two & boyling latter
part spoke the gay head with five whales
so ends this day

Friday 20th There 24 hours commences
with light winds steered of S & long
the ice bound to ice & opposite
middle and latter part fine

Saturday 21st There 24 hours commences
with light light winds from the W
& steering N E middle part fine
winds from the N saw no ice
