Monday 23 There 24 hours commences with light backing winds saw the land of Cape Sison middle part calms middle part stood close in and lured three boats and went after wood in one hour returned loaded with wood latter part saw several ships & beating in to the N.E. so ended

Wednesday 24 There 24 hours commences with strong winds from the N & beating to the N & long the ice in company with the gay head middle part fine latter part steered of S.W. in company with a number of ships

Sat 40.40 L 163.00
Thursday 25 There 24 hours commences with light winds & steering S.W. middle part winds from the S.E. latter part strong winds from the S.E. & steering S.W. took in light sail and doubled reefed the topsails and hauled the gill and main sail middle and latter part the same

Sat 40.00 L 1
Friday 26 There 24 hours commences with the winds more moderate set all sail winds from S.E. & steering S.W. middle part the same latter part the same

Saturday 27 There 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the S.E. & steering S.W. middle part clear saw one ship bound to the E. middle part thick latter part clear saw the ice east of to the N & long the ice so ended

Sat 413 L 173.00
Sunday 28 There 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the S. wind. a thick fog halted to and layed with the four yard & back latter part clear east of to the N.E. & long the ice so ended

Sat 44.00
Monday 29 There 24 hours commences with light winds from the S & steering & long the ice to the N middle part winds from the W and moderate latter part fine saw a number of sails

Sat 41.10 L 171.05

Tuesday 30 There 24 hours commences with strong winds from the S.E. & steering & long the ice to the W middle part saw a number of whales loared three boats but with eight men came on board latter part strong winds

up Sat 40.50 L 172.10

Wednesday 31 of Aug 1860
There 24 hours commences with strong winds from the S & steering & long the ice saw a large number of ships three & beating latter part loared four whales so ended
