

Monday 27 of Sept

These 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from the W & steering sharp by to the S.W. saw whales bore four boats and the starboard boat struck took him a long side and cut him in middle and latter part fine employed in haying seaward

Lat 69° 20' Long 164° 13'

Tuesday 28 These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the W & W middle part the same employed in haying saw several whales & going quick to the S did not bear our boats winds

Wednesday 29 These 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from the west & heaving to the S & E employed in haying latter part saw whales bore all four boats but with ought success came on board saw a number of ships & whaling so ends

Lat 69° 10' Long 164° 19'

Thursday 30 These 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from the W finished haying saw whales bore four boats and the starboard boat struck took him a long side and cut him in latter part employed in stowing down in the four hold saw two ships take whales so ends

Saturday 21 These 24 hours commenced with fine weather and light winds from West employed in haying middle part strong winds West reefed the topsails latter part more moderate

Lat 69° 50' Long 164° 20'

Sunday 3 Sept 1866

These 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the W first part saw whales bore three boats and chased five hours and came on middle part latter part strong winds employed in haying saw a few wild whales

Monday 24 These 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the W & W under short sail & haying saw a number of ships middle part the same spoke the Bark Robert Harris with ten whales and the Orpheus with four whales middle part strong winds so ends this day

Tuesday 25 These 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the N.W. employed in haying middle part saw whales bore but with ought success latter part spoke the Merline with seven whales so ends

Lat 69° 15'

Wednesday 26 These 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the N.W. first part saw whales bore and the waist boat struck at 5 p.m. took him a long side and cut him in middle part strong winds from the N. latter part more wind took in all sail & heaving to the S latter part more wind took in all sail employed in heaving & ought for shoals so ends
