

Saturday 6 of Oct 1866

These 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the N.W. & steering S by E at 4 p.m. finished stowing down at 5 p.m. spoke the bark Florence of Honolulu with six whales this season middle part sailing latter part fine so ends

Lat 57.20

Sunday 7 These 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the N.E. & steering S.E. in company with the Florence saw a ship & lay by at sun down took in light sail and hauled by the wind at day light steered of S.E. at 10 a.m. saw St. Pauls island. latter part strong winds so ends

No Observations

Monday 8 These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the N.E. & steering S by E at 3 p.m. took in sail and doubled reefed middle part rainy latter part strong winds more to the N. & steering S by E 1/2 E so ends

Lat 53.50 L 171.20

Tuesday 9 These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the N. & steering S by E employed in stowing & way home at sun down took in all sail exceptin clost reefed topsails at 8 p.m. hauled to of the seventy two passage dist forty miles at day light steered of S by E saw the land dist twenty miles latter part passed several islands steered S.E. saw a bark & steering S.E. called her the Florence so ends

Thursday 10 of October 1866

These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the N.W. & steering S.E. all sail set employed in clearing up between decks latter part bent the four top gamsail and topmast sliding sails and set them so ends

Lat 49.19 L

Friday 11 These 24 hours commences with the winds more moderate from the N.W. saw two sails at 1 p.m. spoke the bark Robert towns of Sidney middle part winds from the E with rain latter part winds hauled to the N steered S.E. saw two sails so ends

Lat 45.38 L

Saturday 12 These 24 hours commences with moderate winds and a heavy swell & running middle part winds hauled around to the W latter part strong winds and heavy squalls took in stiding sails and light sail so ends

Lat 43.27 L 165.30

Sunday 13 These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the W & carrying whole topsails and main sail middle part squally and heavy squalls of rain latter part clear set all sail winds more to the N so ends

Lat 40.50 L 162.30

Monday 14 These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the N.W. & steering S.E. by E first part shifted over the stiding sails middle part at day light commenced to work ship latter part strong winds from the N took in stiding sails and light sail Lat 38.31 L 162.10
