twenty miles & ends

Sunday 30 these 24 hours
commences with calms and some
foggy saw a sail latter part light
winds from the W steered & long
the land to the E & ends

Lat 32.53
Monday 31 these 24 hours commences
with light winds from the W & steering
& long the land at 3 p.m. saw several
boats of a whaling from the shore saw &
bark anchor at 4 p.m. spoke the boats & belonging
on shore middle and latter part calms

Tuesday 1 of January 1867
these 24 hours commences with
light winds & steering & long the land
to the E latter part saw devil fish
loosed all four boats and chased
but with ought success came on board
spoke the *Protesello* nothing this season
latter part strong winds from the N
& ends

Wednesday 2 January
these 24 hours commences with
fine wether & steering down & long
the land middle part calms

Thursday 3 these 24 hours commences
with fine wether light winds from
the W first part cast anchor
at day light sent the boats of a long
the shore & whaling latter part fine

Friday 4 these 24 hours commences
with light winds and fine wether
latter part the boats returned got nothing
saw a number of whals & going quick
at day light sent the boats of middle
part fine & ends

Saturday 5 these 24 hours commences
with light winds from the N.W. & lying
at anchor and the boats in the shore
& cruising for whals at sun down the
boats returned saw a number of whals
& going quick got nothing

Sunday 6 these 24 hours commences
with fine wether at day light sent
the boats of to cruise for whals
middle and latter part fine

Monday 7 these 24 hours commences
with light winds from the W at day
light took our anchor and sent
the boats down the coast middle
and latter part fine
