

¹⁷Friday 18 January These 24 hours commences with light baffling winds employed in stowing down our sperm oil in the main hold full first part saw the John Pth & lying at anchor & baying at 4 p.m. finished stowing middle and latter part & steering S.E. land dist 20 miles

Saturday 19 These 24 hours fine with and light westerly winds & steering S.E. middle part fine at day light steered down & along the shore for Margreter bay latter part fine no ends

Lat 29.49

Sunday 20 These 24 hours commences with light winds from the W & steering & along the shore at 8 p.m. cast anchor in the mouth of Margreter bay in thirteen fathoms of water at day light sent the boats of up the bay & fishing and gunning saw no whales so ends

Monday 21 These 24 hours commences with fine weather & lying at anchor at sun down the boats returned with a few fish and full the General Scott at anchor up the bay at day light hove short winds light tide & head at 9 a.m. set sail and steered right of the bay the G. Scott took her anchor also latter part fine no ends

Tuesday 22 These 24 hours commences with light winds & steering & along the land at 4 p.m. saw two ships & lying in lee bay the capt. Coored & boat and went on board of the Peimdeer and the three Brothers having five whales the two & mately latter part calm

¹⁸Wednesday 23 January 1867

These 24 hours commences with calms middle part the same latter part light winds from the W & steering down & along the land for Cape St Lucas saw a ship & head of us

Thursday 24 These 24 hours commences with light winds employed in breaking out for provisions middle part saw a steamer at 4 a.m. stood in for the Cape and the capt. went on shore in company with the Capt of the General Scott latter part & lying of and on

Friday 25 These 24 hours commences with light winds & lying of and on at Cape St Lucas the capt. on shore at 6 p.m. the capt. returned light winds and calms middle part winds beased up from the N. took in light sail at 3 p.m. more wind doubled reefed the topsails & heading to the N.E. at day light steered of S.E. latter part the same no ends

Saturday 26 These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the N.W. & steering S.E. middle part more moderate at day light saw the islands called the three Marias latter part more moderate

Sunday 27 These 24 hours commences with light winds from the W & steering down for the land at sun down took in sail and hove to of the Middle islands at 10 a.m. stood in and cast anchor in fifteen fathoms of water no ends
