

February 23 1867

Thursday These 24 hours commences with strong trades & steering W by S bent the main sail and shifted over the standing sails middle part the same at day light winds halled to the south and had some heavy squalls took in all sail except the clost reefed main topsail no ends

Friday 24 these 24 hours commences with strong winds and rainy winds halled to the N E for ship to the W at 2 p.m. more moderate set sail and steered W by S middle part rainy latter part employed in washing ship no ends

Lat 20.10 L 154.17

Saturday 25 These 24 hours commences with strong trades & steering W by S at sun down took in sail and halled to the S thick and rainy at day light saw the land 10 miles latter part steered down & long the land thick and rainy no ends

Sunday 26 These 24 hours commences with light trades and rainy at 2 p.m. cast anchor in kela bay in four fathom of water at sun down all hands on shore latter part in middle and latter part fine

Monday 27 These 24 hours fine all hands employed in discharging oil on board of the schooner Albermar to go at Honolulu

February 28 1867 Tuesday

These 24 hours fine finished the oil middle part some rainy latter part breaking eight fur shoeks to set up to put water in three schooners mules for Honolulu

Wednesday 29 These 24 hours commences with fine wether employed in setting up shoeks and getting of water middle part fine

Thursday 30 These 24 hours some rainy all hands employed in getting of water and steering it is very middle and latter part some rainy

Friday 31 of March

These 24 hours fine all hands employed in getting water middle and latter part the same

Saturday 2 These 24 hours commences with fine wether all hands employed in getting water middle and latter part fine sent the Starboard watch on liberty

Sunday 3 fine wether sent the Starboard watch on liberty

Monday 4 These 24 hours commences with fine wether sent the Starboard watch on liberty employed in fixing the fore and main yard slings

Tuesday 5 These 24 hours commences with fine wether sent the Starboard watch on liberty employed in getting of molasses and recruiting
