Tuesday²³ There 24 hours commences
with light winds from the S and a heavy

saw boats holed two boats and the
starboard boat struck and the whale
run in the ice and the iron drew
so ends some foggy saw the land
dist 20 miles of

Wednesday There 24 hours commences
with light winds from the S a running
down the ice saw whales and holed two
boats and the starboard boat struck
and the whale run the ice and took the line
latter part holed a gain two boats and
the starboard boat struck took him a long
side commenced to cut so ends the land in sight

Thursday²⁵ There 24 hours commences
with light winds from the S.W. employed
in cutting two boats of at 4 p.m. finished
cutting and spoke the Reindeer
a cutting her third whale middle part
fine latter part holed for whales but with ought
success so ends employed in boyling

Friday²⁶ There 24 hours commences
with fine weather winds from the S
at 5 p.m. saw whales holed all four
boats and the starboard boat struck
at six took him a long side and
commenced to cut at 11 p.m. finished
latter part saw more whales holed
but with ought success saw the Reindeer
take a whale so ends
