fine sails middle part saw whales
As loaded and chased but with ought
success latter part thick and snowy

Thursday 16 These 24 hours commence
with moderate moderate winds from the
N saw a few wild whales middle part
fine latter part some snow land dist
five miles

Friday 17 These 24 hours light winds
from the N^W saw whales loaded and the
starboard boat struck took him a long
ride and cut him in middle part
the stormy winds & latter part the same

Saturday 18 These 24 hours commence
with light winds from the E
employed in hollyboyling saw a few
whales a going quick down a long the land
middle and latter part fine saw four
sheeps a boyling so ends

Sunday 19 These 24 hours commence
with moderate winds from the N^W
employed in boyling saw a few whales
middle part fine so ends

Monday 20 These 24 hours commence
with fine weather and light winds from the
E employed in boyling saw four ships
a boyling latter part saw whales loaded for
them but with ought success
