Sunday⁹ there 24 hours
commences with moderate winds
from the N & E employed in stery
down our oil middle and latter
part fine saw three ships

Monday¹⁰ there 24 hours commens
with moderate winds from the S & E
employed in clearing aught between
decks middle part foggy latter part
clear so ends

Tuesday¹¹ there 24 hours commens
with fine wether and light winds from
the S & E middle part spook the
barke active with one whale this season
latter part foggy so ends

Wednesday¹² there 24 hours commens
with light winds from the S & a stery
to the W middle and latter part
foggy so ends

Thursday¹³ there 24 hours commens
with light winds and calms
saw one whale & going to the N & E
and saw ten ships there & boylng

Friday¹⁴ there 24 hours commens
with light boylng winds saw several
whales & going quick to the N at 4 pm
spook the Ocean clean latter part foggy

Saturday¹⁵ there 24 hours commens
with light winds from the N & a stery
S & E saw several ships none & going
S and some W so ends
