latter part spook the Remidier with
five whales and saw twenty five sails

Wednesday 19 There 24 hours fine
saw whales loared and the waist boat
struck at 7 am took him a long side
and cut him in latter part commences
to boil ten sail in sight

commences with light winds from the
N a hedding to the E middle part
saw whals loared three boats
and the bow boat struck took
him a long side and cut him
in saw a large number of ships

Friday 21 of June

There 24 hours commences
with light winds from the N employed
in boyling latter part picked up a
dead whale took him a long side
and cut him in so ends

Saturday 22 There 24 hours fine
light winds from the N & E
employed in boyling and stowing down
middle and latter part fine

Lat 68° 30'

Sunday 23 There 24 hours
fine wether employed in boyling
middle part spook the Gay head
latter part the same saw a number
of ships and saw four ships a boyly

Lat 68° 40'

Monday 24 There 24 hours fine
wether employed in boyling middle
part the same
latter part fine saw boyly seven

Tuesday 25 There 24 hours
fine and light winds from the
E a stery in to the W so ends

Wednesday 26 There 24 hours
light winds from the E employed
in stowing down some oil
middle part some foggy
latter part clear
