

Thursday 24 July

There 24 hours commenced with calms. Hoisted four boats for devil fish but with slight success. Middle part burned a devil fish from the ship. Hoisted and got him. Took him a long ride. A number of canoes came off from the shore. Latter part strong winds from the W. steered S. & some foggy.

^{sup}Friday 25 There 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S.W. and foggy at 5 pm it cleared up. Spoke the ship General Scott from Codrington. Clear middle and latter part. Calms put on all four boats and towed the ship in to St. Lawrence bay and anchored in ten fathom of water and sent a raft on shore to fill no ends.

Saturday 26 There 24 hours calms. A lying at anchor. First part got off the water and started the works to boil our devil fish. Middle and latter part calms.

Sunday 27 There 24 hours commenced with calms. A lying at anchor in St. Lawrence bay. A lying - middle part light winds from the R. got underway. Latter part calms. no ends.

Monday 28 There 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S. & backing up. A long the shore. Middle part calms. At 10 the anchor in seven fathom at 2 pm. Light winds from the S. got underway. no ends.

Tuesday 30 of July

There 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S. & backing up. A long the shore. Middle part saw the wreck of the Ontario. A shore. Latter part employed in stowing down water.

^{sup}Wednesday 31 There 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S.W. & backing to the S. employed in bending the four top gun-ropes and four royal.

Thursday 1 There 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S.W. Middle part passed St. Lawrence island. Latter part winds from the N. employed in bending standing sails and set them.

^{sup}Friday 2 There 24 hours commenced with light winds from the N. & steering S by E. Middle part rainy. Latter part clear. Strong winds. no ends.

Saturday 3 There 24 hours commenced with strong winds & steering S by E. at 2 pm saw St. Mathew's island. Middle part foggy. Latter part clear. no ends.

No Observation

Sunday 4 There 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from the N. & steering S. & D. Middle part took in light sail and hauled to & back at day light saw the island of St. Pauls. Latter part fine. saw nothing. no ends.
