

Monday¹⁶ of Dec 1867

There 24 hours commences with strong trades with squalls took in light sail and doubled reefed the topsails Magalina in sight middle part fine latter part bent a new or four topsail so ends

Lat 10,30 Long 139,00

Tuesday¹⁷ There 24 hours commences with light winds a standing in fore the island first part bent a new main topsail and starting water

at day light stood in shore at 9 a.m. the natives came off from Magalina island at 11 a.m. the capt went on shore so ends

Wednesday¹⁸ There 24 hours commences with light winds a lying of and on at Magalina island the capt on shore at 5 p.m. the capt returned with recruits middle part fine latter part bent a new Spanker so ends

Thursday¹⁹ There 24 hours commences with light winds the land dist 10 miles middle part rainy at day light stood in for the island of Magalina at 10 a.m. the capt went on shore to get recruits at latter part rainy so ends

Friday²⁰ There 24 hours commences with strong trades a lying of and on the capt on shore at 4 p.m. returned middle part stood of latter part strong winds doubled reefed the topsails

Saturday²¹ There 24 hours commences with strong winds a cruising of and the island middle part rainy latter part employed in various jobs a brought the ship

Sunday²² There 24 hours commences with moderate winds a hedding in for the land middle part fine latter part saw a rock a bearing N 20 miles from Magalina so ends

Monday²³ There 24 hours commences with light trades lowered a boat and went to the rock to catch some fish but found none middle part a hedding to the N latter part a canoe came off from Magalina so ends

Tuesday²⁴ There 24 hours commences with moderate winds a hedding to the S. E. middle and latter part fine

Wednesday²⁵ There 24 hours commences with light trades a hedding of shore middle part fine latter part the same land dist 10 miles
