

Monday 3rd of Feb 1868

There 24 hours commences with light winds from the S.E. & steering down long the island of Ojhee bound in to Kelikure bay at 4 p.m. got the anchors of the bow the bay dist 20 miles at sundown calm at day light light winds from the S at 9 a.m. the capt went on shore at Kelikure bay so ends

Tuesday 4th There 24 hours commences with light south winds at 2 p.m. the capt came off with the pilot at 4 p.m. anchored in the bay in seventeen fathom of water middle part fine at day light commenced to set up rigging so ends

Wednesday 5th There 24 hours commences with fine wether all hands employed in getting of wood so ends

Thursday 6th There 24 hours fine sent the starboard watch on liberty one man deserted so ends

Friday 7th fine sent the Starboard watch on liberty at sun down they all returned excepting to men which had run away

Saturday 8th this day fine sent the starboard watch on liberty employed in fitting rigging at sun down the men returned so ends the ship ocean arrived

Sunday 9th of Feb 1868

There 24 hours commences with fine wether all hands on board a smoking ship so ends

Monday 10th There 24 hours fine sent the starboard watch on liberty at sun down they all returned had caught one man so ends

Tuesday 11th fine sent the starboard watch on liberty employed in pumping ship caught rice

Wednesday 12th There 24 hours commences with fine wether but to reef on shore to get of potatoes so ends all hands on board

Thursday 13th There 24 hours fine sent five cash on shore to fill with potatoes and to them through the reef

Friday 14th There 24 hours commences with fine wether got all of our potatoes of and got ready for sea

Saturday 15th fine employed in getting of recruits at day light took our anchor light winds of the land so ends

Sunday 16th There 24 hours commences with light winds from the S.W. & steering a long the land middle and latter part fine
