Thursday 20 Shore 24 hours commences with light baffling winds employed in painting the boats and rattling down the rigging of and on the capt on shore so ends

Friday 21 Shore 24 hours commences with calms at 8 p.m. a schooner came of with our provisions took them one hour employed in rattling down

Saturday 22 Shore 24 hours commences with light trades employed in stowing down our provisions one thousand lbs of meat and five lbs of molasses

Sunday 23 of February 1868 Shore 24 hours commences with strong trades of and on at Oahu middle and latter part strong trades

Monday 24 Shore 24 hours commences with strong trades a lying of and on employed in various jobs a bought the ship middle and latter part fine

Tuesday 25 Shore strong trades a lying of and on employed in heaving the sails middle and latter part strong trades

Wednesday 26 Shore 24 hours commences with strong trades a lying of and on at Honolulu middle and latter part sailing

Thursday 27 Shore 24 hours commences with strong trades at 4 p.m. the capt came of from the shore and brought two men that run a way at Oahu steered of to the W middle part strong winds a strong N by W latter part the same

Friday 28 Shore 24 hours commences with strong trades a strong N by W first part took in light sail middle part doubled reefed the topsails and took in the main sail

Sat 29 30 40
