Shine 24 hours commences with light winds from the N a hudding in shore land dist 20 miles middle part the same latter part fine no winds

Monday 30 Shine 24 hours fine ship in the ice at 6 am light winds from the E worked caught of the ice latter part strong winds in clear water & working to the E latter part snowy

Tuesday 30 Shine 24 hours commences with strong winds from the E a beating to the E up a long the ice middle part strong winds took in sail latter part a strong gale took in all sail exceptin' cloast reefed main topsail so ends No Observation

Wednesday 31 Shine 24 hours commences with a strong gale from the E a hudding to the S at 8 sun down moderate set some sail and wor ship to the S middle and latter part moderate

Lat 61.19

Thursday 1 Shine 24 hours commences with light winds from the N W the land dist 20 miles middle part calms latter part a working to the E through the ice so ends

Friday 2 of April 1868

Shine 24 hours commences with light winds from the W a working through the ice to the E middle part calms the land dist 15 miles latter part fine

Saturday 3 Shine 24 hours commences with light winds from the N W a working in to the N E through the ice latter part strong winds from the N W

Lat 61.12 Long 176.40 E

Sunday 4 Shine 24 hours commences with strong winds from the N W a working in to the N through the ice at sun down took in sail latter part a heavy swell from the S E worked through the ice in clear water so ends

Lat 61.14 Long 177.11 E

Monday 5 Shine 24 hours commences with strong winds from the N W and a heavy swell a heaving from the S E saw the land dist 20 miles middle part the same latter part more moderate winds heaved to the N W so ends

Lat 61.10 Long 177.30 E

Tuesday 6 Shine 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the N W a hudding to the N E through the ice middle part thick and snowy latter part clear & working to the E so ends

Lat 61.05 Long 177.30
