Shine 24 hours fine light winds from the S a strong a long the ice to the N.E. latter part saw twenty sail and five a boiling in the ice no ends

Sunday 31st Shine 24 hours commences with light winds saw whales and boared and the starboard boat struck at 1.30 took him a long side and cut him in. latter part fine fine in the ice no ends

Monday 1st June 24 hours commences with light winds from the S.E. a working through the ice to the N in company with several ships latter part started the works no ends

Tuesday 2nd June 24 hours commences with light winds from the S a strong in fore cape Berry first part spoke the gay head with one whale latter part calms fast in the ice employed in boiling no ends

Wednesday 3rd June 24 hours commences with strong winds from the N.E. took in all sail a lying in the ice latter part finished boiling saw cape Berry a bearing N.W. dist twenty miles saw seven ships in under the land in clear water no ends

Thursday 4th June 1858

Shine 24 hours commences with strong winds from the N.E. a lying in the ice saw the land of Cape Berry and several ships in shore latter part calms no ends

Friday 5th June 24 hours commences with light boating winds a ship in the ice all sail set a working in shore employed in stowing down our oil in the main hold latter part snow saw several sail no ends

Saturday 6th June 24 hours strong winds from the N.E. a lying in a small space of clear water under short sail weather thick latter part some clear saw the land dist ten miles no ends

Sunday 7th June 24 hours commences with strong winds from the N.E. a lying in a small space of clear water at 6 p.m. the hole closed up took in all sail and drifted with the ice latter part the same

Monday 8th June 24 hours commences with light winds from the N.E. a lying in the ice with all sail in saw a large number of ships in the ice land dist ten miles no ends
