Sunday 28 of June 1868

Shine of hours commences
with moderate winds with rain
a stormy in for the land
employed in boylig middle
part it cleared some saw the
land of cappe Berring latter
part finished boylig with foggy

Monday 29 shine 24 hours
some foggy and winds light steered
down for the sand spitt saw two ships
at anchor at 1 p.m. the capt took his
boat and went on board of the Washington
which layed behind of the sand spitt
repairing her bow which had ben stoven
by the ice at 4 p.m. the capt came on
board and we went in at anchor
latter part employed in healing ships
and fixing our copper and stoving down

Tuesday 30 shine 24 hours commences
with fine wether and calms employed
in stoving down our oil and took
from the Washington three cask of bread
latter part the Washington got under weigh
for flower bay at 9 p.m. we got under
weigh in company with the Nantatus
and stood to the W at 4 p.m.
saw two whals boared in company
with the Nantatus boats and they struck
one saw her take him a long side
at 8 p.m. came in rainy let go our
anchor in six fathoms of water at 9 here
it up a gain

Wednesday 30 of June 1868

Shine 24 hours commences with
light winds and rising at 8 a.m.
at ded a way let go our anchor
latter part clear saw the natives a boylig
no ends at anchor

Thursday 1 of July

Shine 24 hours commences with
light winds from the W took our
anchor and stood in to the S.W.
saw several ships latter part stood
stood in and anchored in company
with several ships no ends

Friday 2 of July

Shine 24 hours commences
with strong winds from the N
took our anchor and stood to
the W until we saw the ice and
returned back middle part anchored
a gain latter part it moderate
a gain got under weigh and stood
aught

Saturday 3 of July

Shine 24 hours
commences with light winds
boared for two hump backs but
with aught success latter part
saw a boared boared in company
with the Normans boats and
they struck one latter part saw
no more steered to the E
in company with the ship Rambler
saw two ships a boylig
