

Sunday 3 of July 1828

Shore 24 hours commences with light winds from the W & steering S.W. & saw several sails up to the ice middle part winds light latter part calms & ends

Monday 4 Shore 24 hours light winds from the S and fine wether latter part winds baffly on bent the new main topail and mended the old one and put on new back ropes on it and bent it & ends

Tuesday 5 Shore 24 hours commences with fine wether and light baffly winds latter part light winds from the S steered for Coppe Perry came in thick and rainy & ends

Wednesday 6 Shore 24 hours commences with light winds from the S.E. & heading to the S thick wether at 5 P.M. made the land of Coppe Perry and a knue came of laded with skins and wanted us to take the boat on deck and carry them down to flower bay latter part winds from the S and thick

Thursday 7 Shore 24 hours commences with light winds from the S.E. & heading up a long the land latter part foggy and light winds and a heavy swell & setting from the S.E. & ends

Friday 8 of July

Shore 24 hours commences with light S.E. winds and foggy & working to the S up a long the land middle and latter part the same

Saturday 9 Shore 24 hours commences with light winds from the S.E. went in of W head and let go our anchor and sent a boat in to look for a watering place and it being so such a heavy swell & setting in that we could not get in at 4 P.M. took our anchor and went up the bay behind the sand spit ~~to~~ and anchored in twenty seven fathom of water and sent in a raft to fill the ~~active~~ & lying hear repairing redder

Sunday 10 Shore 24 hours commences with light winds and rainy took in one raft of one hundred lbs and stored it a way and got one more raft of thirty lbs latter part calms & ends short

Monday 11 Shore 24 hours commences with strong winds from the W got under weigh and stood bet ought of the bay in company with the active latter part steered S.E. winds from the S with foggy wether and moderate

Tuesday 12 Shore 24 hours commences with light winds and foggy & standing to the W at 2 P.M. it cleared & our ship to the S.E. saw St. Lawrence island bet ten miles latter part foggy
