These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the S<sup>W</sup> a heddly of shore middle part tak in gale and sparker latter part wor ship to the S<sup>E</sup> thick with rain so ends.

Saturday 25 These 24 hours commences with the winds more moderate from the S<sup>W</sup> and clear saw a bark a standing in shore latter part fine so ends land dist 30 miles

<sup>15</sup> Sunday 26 These 24 hours commences with light winds from the S<sup>W</sup> a heddly to the S a long the land employed in boyling middle part foggy latter part the same

Lat 40 Long 165 30

<sup>16</sup> Monday 27 These 24 hours commences with light winds from the N a steery W middle part fairs here boyling latter part strong winds from the W employed in stoving down our oil

Lat 56 08 Long 165 43 <sup>17</sup> W

Tuesday 28 These 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the W a heddly to the S at 4pm saw a light whale boared all four boats and chased until eight o'clock and it came in thick came on board middle and latter part thick and strong winds from the N<sup>E</sup> ceeped and took in the gale

<sup>18</sup> Wednesday 29 of July

These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the W under short sail thick and rainy middle part more moderate but foggy latter part some clear set some sail a heddly to the S so ends

Lat 56 13 Long

Thursday 30 These 24 hours commences with light winds from the W first part saw wright whals boared all four boats and chased but with aught seen whals shy middle and latter part fine

<sup>19</sup> Friday 31 These 24 hours commences with light winds and foggy first part saw wright whals boared three boats and it came in foggy came on board employed in coiling new lines

Saturday 1 These 24 hours commences with light winds from the W and foggy middle and latter part calms so ends

Sunday 2 These 24 hours commences with light winds from the N<sup>W</sup> a steery to the S<sup>W</sup> middle part calms latter part clear light winds from the N<sup>E</sup> so ends
